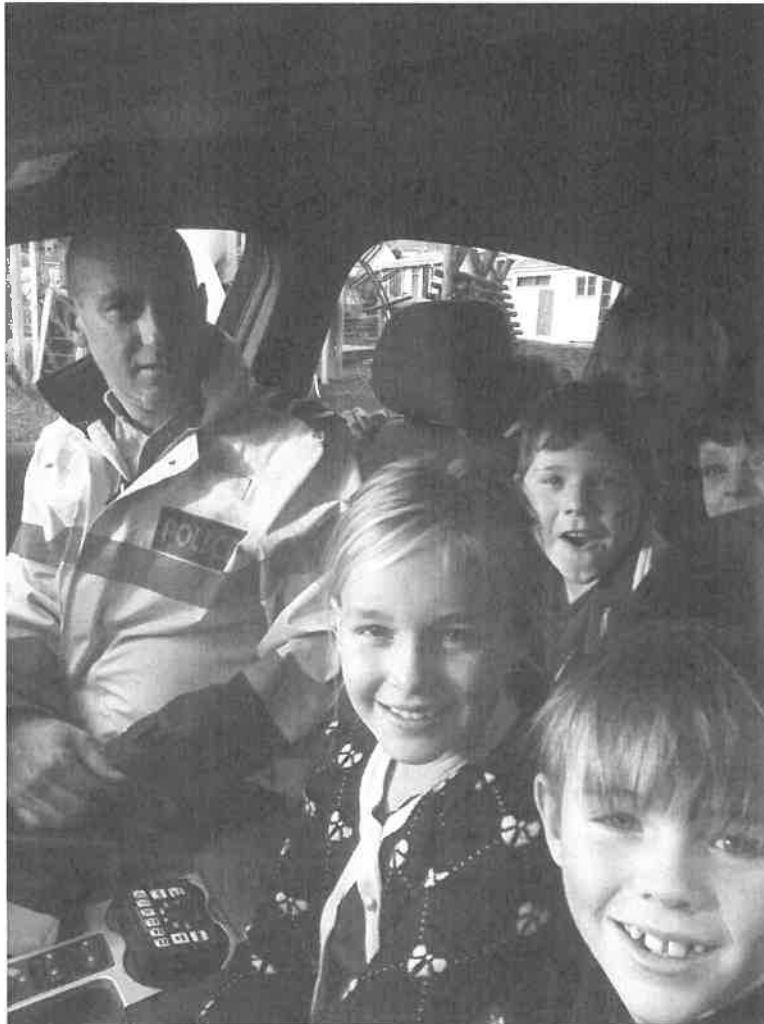

## **LATE STARTS OR SCHOOL CANCELLATION DUE TO WEATHER CONDITIONS**

As June approaches I thought it might be wise to remind parents of the processes that are in place for our School and other Dunedin Schools in case of adverse weather conditions such as snow and ice.

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations. It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made are that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

It is great if you hear school is off that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school.

## **How a Spider Makes a Web**

Have you ever wondered how a spider makes its web?

The purpose of a spider's web is to protect its young, catch prey and for survival.

The web is made of silk and here's a bonus it is made of different types of silk. It's got 2 main types of silk, a strong type and a sticky one. The silk is made in the abdomen and uses spinnerets to release it.

Now I'm going to tell you about the construction. First the spider lets out a piece of sticky silk and lets it float over to another object in the breeze. Then the spider creates a Y-shape underneath the first piece of silk. After that the spider creates some spokes (spoke - a rod used to support something e.g. rods on a bike wheel) then the spider creates spirals using sticky silk.

For the first stage of the web it will use strong silk. However the very first part of the web is sticky silk. After the spider is done with the strong silk it will switch to sticky silk.

On to the next thing which is catching its prey. It hides with a foot on the web at all times. If it feels a vibration it will run out and have a snack.

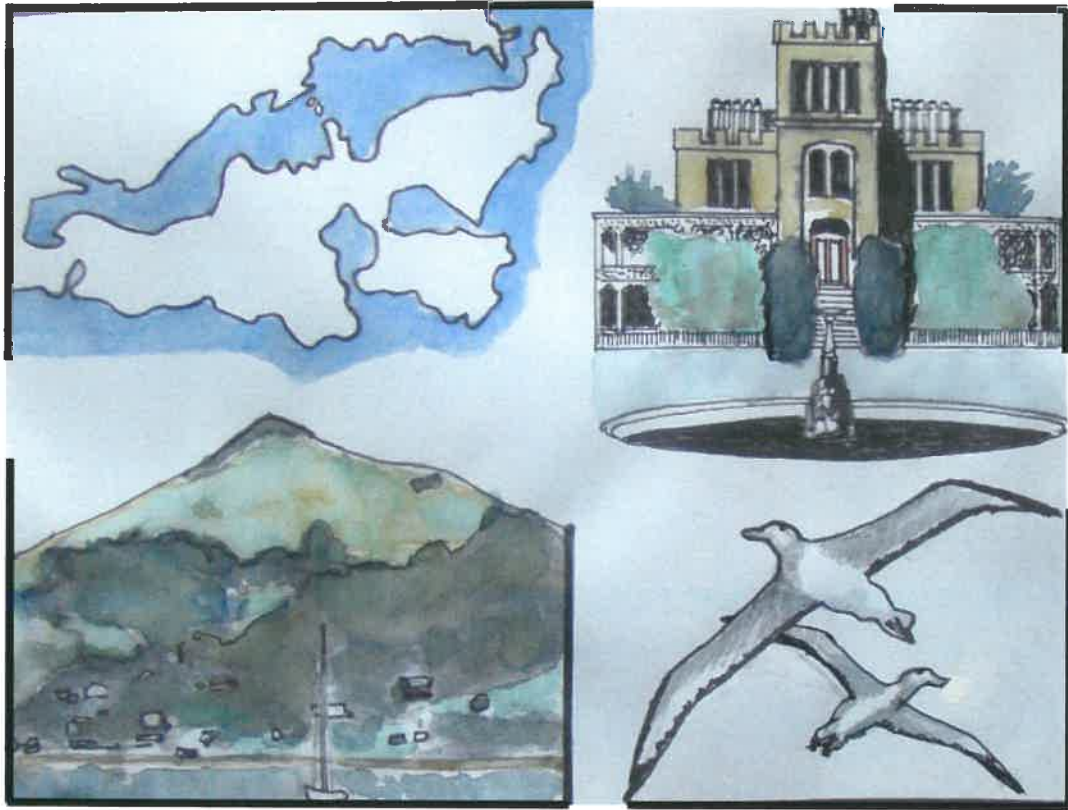

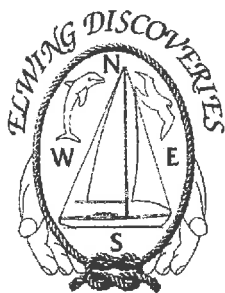

**Year 6-8 Adventurers**

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Planning is now underway for this expedition. The programme will be full and challenging, though geared to the age and ability of the individuals concerned. Your adventure participants will live together on board "Elwing" and sail around different parts of Paterson Inlet Stewart Island, anchoring in different bays to suit the weather forecast. Elwing Discoveries is a DOC approved Concessionaire and this will add significantly to your young adventurer's voyage! During their travels the participants should sight a number of things of interest – birds, seals, shags, albatrosses, land formation, historic sites. 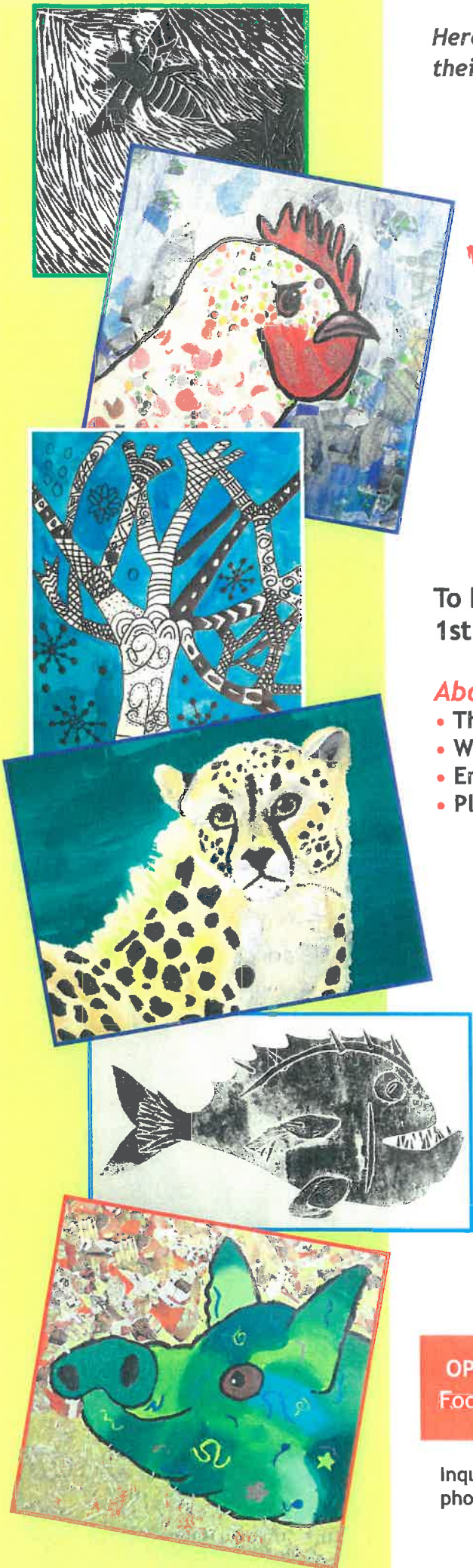
