KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE PROGRAMME

Over recent weeks we have been teaching the personal safety programme *Keeping Ourselves Safe*.

Keeping Ourselves Safe has been designed to give students the skills to cope in situations involving abuse. It has three overall aims:

- to develop and strengthen children's skills to keep themselves safe with other people;
- to support and encourage abused children to get help from caring adults;
- to make teachers and parents/caregivers more aware of the need to keep children safe from abuse by adults or other children.

Keeping Ourselves Safe will be taught by your child's teacher, with support from Ross Greer, a local Police School Community Officer as required.

To be successful, *Keeping Ourselves Safe* needs your help and support. Your child may possibly have homework activities to work on with you.

It is important that you participate as much as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving, and help your child to use his or her new skills with confidence.

If you weren't able to make it along to the Parent Information Meeting then google Keeping Ourselves Safe and you will click on the Police website where there is lots of information for parents and an outline of the programme , lesson by lesson.

We have really enjoyed having Charlotte Hutchison teaching our New Entrants this year and she has done a lovely job with them. Charlotte is moving to Southland though as she has met a very nice dairy farmer so she has been appointed to a permanent job at Wyndham School starting Term 1 next year. Congratulations on your new job Miss H!

We have advertised and appointed a permanent New Entrant teacher- Mel Gaul who will join us at the start of Term 1. Mel currently teaches at Grants Braes School and we think she will be an excellent fit for our school. I am sure you will all look forward to getting to know her next year.

Mr Mitchell is going to take Term 1 and 2 Paternity leave next year to spend time with his beautiful daughter Elysse. Mr Direen has applied for a Science Teaching Leadership Programme where he will do an in depth programme working with local scientists for 2 terms next year away from the school and he plans to do that in Terms 3 and 4. We thought a good way of managing these periods of leave was for Mr D and Mr Mitchell to share the Year 5 teaching role next year so Mr D will be teaching Korimako class for Terms 1 and 2 and Mr Mitchell will teach them for the last two terms of the year.

We have therefore advertised for a Year 4 teacher just for next year and will make that appointment in the next few weeks. I am sure we will get someone good for this role as people enjoy teaching at our school.

We will benefit hugely from Mr D's learning in Science as he will come back in 2019 and take a leadership role to help us with getting Science learning really humming at our school. It is already an area that the children enjoy and do well in but we would like to step it up even further.

This coming swimming season we are looking for people to step up and become a part of the pool custodians. We are hoping to have a few people to share the jobs that are needed in the smooth of running the pool over the summer.
