PAINTED POEMS ART WORKSHOP WITH KERRY MACKAY FOR TUI CLASS

Kerry Mackay and Pamela Brown (*theartdept*) are beginning a new art education initiative called '*Painted Poems*'

They have been awarded an Arts Grant from Dunedin City Council and have the support of Dunedin City of Literature, to run art workshops in Dunedin schools, including ours. As visual artists and art educators, they want to celebrate Dunedin's status at an UNESCO City of Literature, with painting workshops for teachers and children in their classrooms. Next week Kerry will come to our school and work with Mrs Brooker and Tui class. We are

very pleased to be one of the schools they have chosen to introduce this new art initiative into.

TERM THREE'S TOPIC: COPING WITH CHALLENGES AND BEING PREPARED

Our recent weather event at the end of the holidays was almost timed uncannily to perfection as our focus this term is on the challenge of survival for people as they prepare for and respond to weather events or natural disasters. We will be thinking about how we can prepare as a family at home, at school and how our community can prepare to cope with the unexpected events that can come along when we least expect them. This is mainly a Health and Social Sciences unit of learning.

We are looking forward to hearing Michelle Poole from the Otago Regional Council talk to the children next week on Wednesday the 9th of August about how to be prepared to cope with things like flooding etc.

We will learn about the science behind the natural forces that cause natural phenomena like floods, earthquakes, tsunamis, tornadoes, cyclones and volcanic eruptions etc as part of this topic too.

WINTER WEATHER AFFECTING SCHOOL STARTING TIMES ETC

It is very timely to remind families what might happen if the weather turns particularly nasty and snow or ice make the roads so dangerous that schools around the city need to be delayed till 10am or closed for the day.

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations. It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made is that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

If you are in doubt please look up the School's website as we always post late starts or school closures on our Homepage: <http://macbayschool.edublogs.org> or just google Macandrew Bay School to get to our website. Keep on looking as we can only do that once we have heard the city wide decision. It is great if you hear school is off that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school. We will also attempt to send all families a text or an email so check your texts and emails too. I tried this out last weekend with our concern about the state of the Bay Road after the slips in case of frost and the text system seemed to work well.

KAIMANUA CHALLENGE, HEALTH TEAM

In Term 3 the Health Team decided to do a Fruit and Vegetable bowl because it's cold and the flu season. So many people only get a small amount of Vitamins and Minerals. So if

you have any spare fruit or vegetables we would really appreciate it if you could please bring them to school so in the afternoon, your teacher will cut it up "so you can all have part of your daily dose of Vitamins and Minerals!"

Each class has been given a few posters, a healthy guide to a healthy heart catalogue and a vegetable cookbook.

We started the Fruit and Vegetable bowl this week.

We have set a challenge for every class to use that Vegetable cookbook to create a dish or two that would be worthy to taste.

VOLUNTARY SCHOOL DONATIONS

Each year we ask for a Voluntary School Donation each term and this money is used to buy reading books, math's equipment, musical instruments, sports equipment, library books and to help provide Teacher Aide Support for the children in the classes. Being a Decile 10 School means our operational funds are not all that generous and the money that comes from locally raised donations makes a big difference to the resources we can provide in the classrooms for our students.

Our suggested School Donations amount this year will be the same as last year - \$25.00 per term or \$100.00 per child. You are more than welcome to pay these per term or for the whole year – whichever suits you. Some parents have set up regular small direct debit contributions and that is fine. It is worth parents knowing that the receipt you receive for any donations made to school can be used for an income tax credit from Inland Revenue. You can pay school donations by internet banking but it is great if you also email and let us know you have done that and then Irene can keep track of all these payments. You need to state clearly your child's name and what the money is for in the reference information.
