**LONG WEEKENDS COMING UP**

The school will be closed on Monday the 21<sup>st</sup> of March to observe Otago Anniversary Day. This will mean that next weekend is a long weekend.

We come back to school for a short 3-day week – Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and then the Easter break begins. This includes Good Friday, Monday and Tuesday after the weekend.

We had originally put the wrong dates in earlier newsletters so that is why we are clarifying which days the school is open and closed. All NZ schools have the Monday and Tuesday as well as Good Friday as public holidays and each province observes its Anniversary Day on its own specific day. Unusually this year these holidays fall in close proximity of each other.

**BOT MATTERS**

We had our first BOT meeting of the year a couple of weeks ago and after doing a property walk about we got into looking at and approving our Charter, Strategic Plan for 2016-2018, and Annual Plan and Annual Targets for this year.

As this year is a BOT election year we will be asking for parents willing to be elected to the School Board of Trustees to put their names forward in two or three months time.

For the past couple of years we have had regular Whanau Hui for the whanau of our Maori students. They are very relaxed get togethers where we have a cup of tea and a chat about what is happening at school for our Maori students and good ideas tend to pop up as we talk. If your children have Maori heritage we would love to have you come along to these meetings. Our Term 1 Whanau Hui will be Wednesday March 16<sup>th</sup> at 3.15pm in the staffroom. The meetings usually go for 45 minutes to an hour at the most and the children usually pop in for afternoon tea and then play in the playground while we meet.

### **ASTHMA**

We have noticed that we are having an increasing number of children with asthma but often we don't have information about this or an inhaler available for them if it is needed. If your child does require an inhaler it would be great if you could supply one with your child's name on it for us to keep in the sickbay for use if required.

### **REMINDER ABOUT DOGS IN THE SCHOOL GROUNDS**

Just a reminder that we ask families and community members not to bring dogs in the School grounds please.

This is for the safety of the children. Some children are very anxious around dogs and the dogs themselves can get stressed or over excited with lots of children rushing around and can behave in uncharacteristic ways. We also don't want dog poo in the School grounds.

## **MANDARIN LESSONS**

Kārearea class started learning the Mandarin language on Thursday this week with Mr. Direen and their Mandarin Language Assistant Liú Xīnyu (surname is first).

We are part of the Peninsula Cluster group that has received funding to provide this opportunity in our schools.

Tahuna are the host school for the programme and they are coordinating it. The class will have a brief Mandarin Lesson each week. Research shows that learning languages is very good for our brains and the earlier we learn languages the easier it is for us.

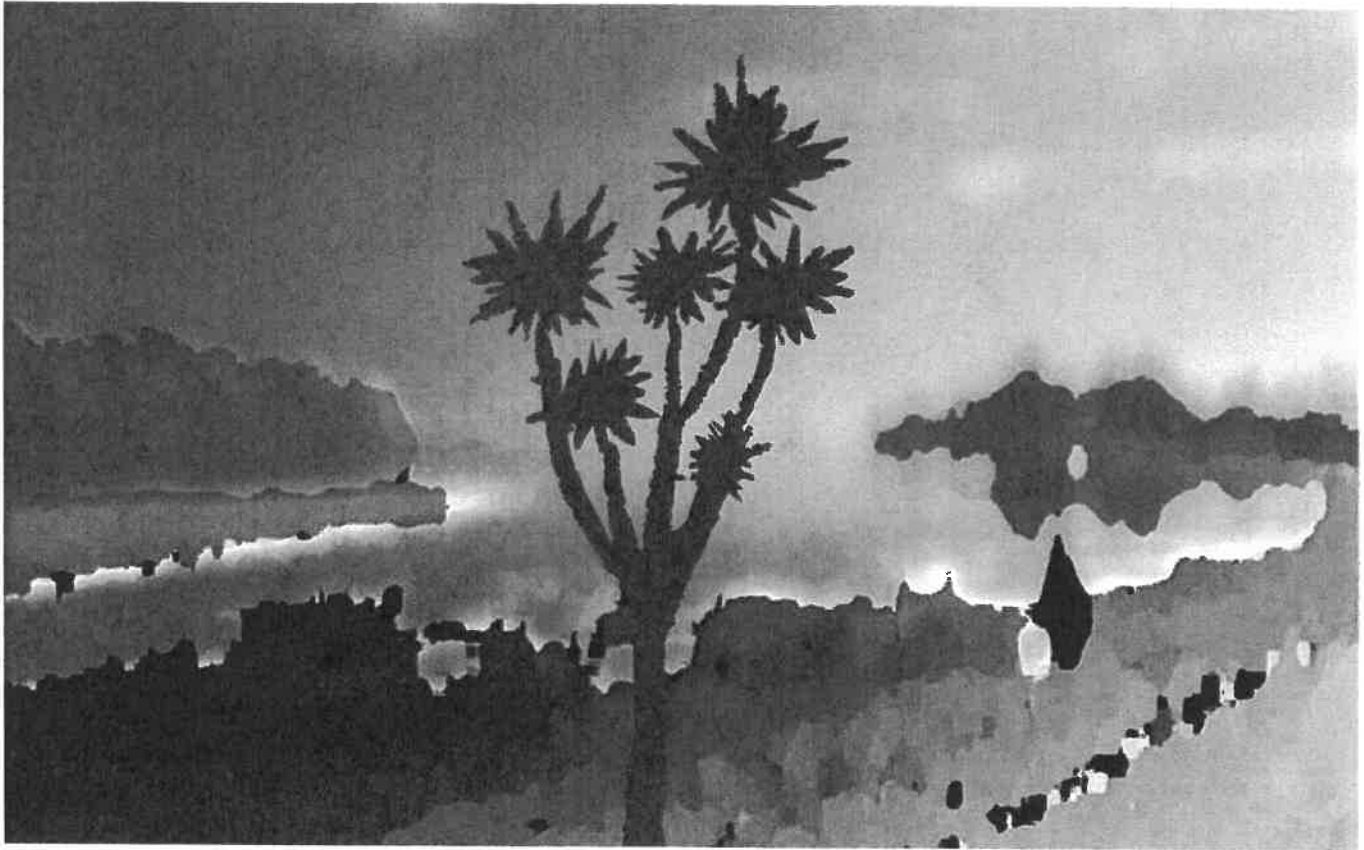

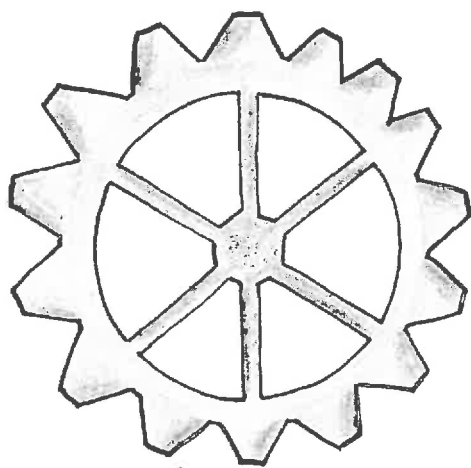

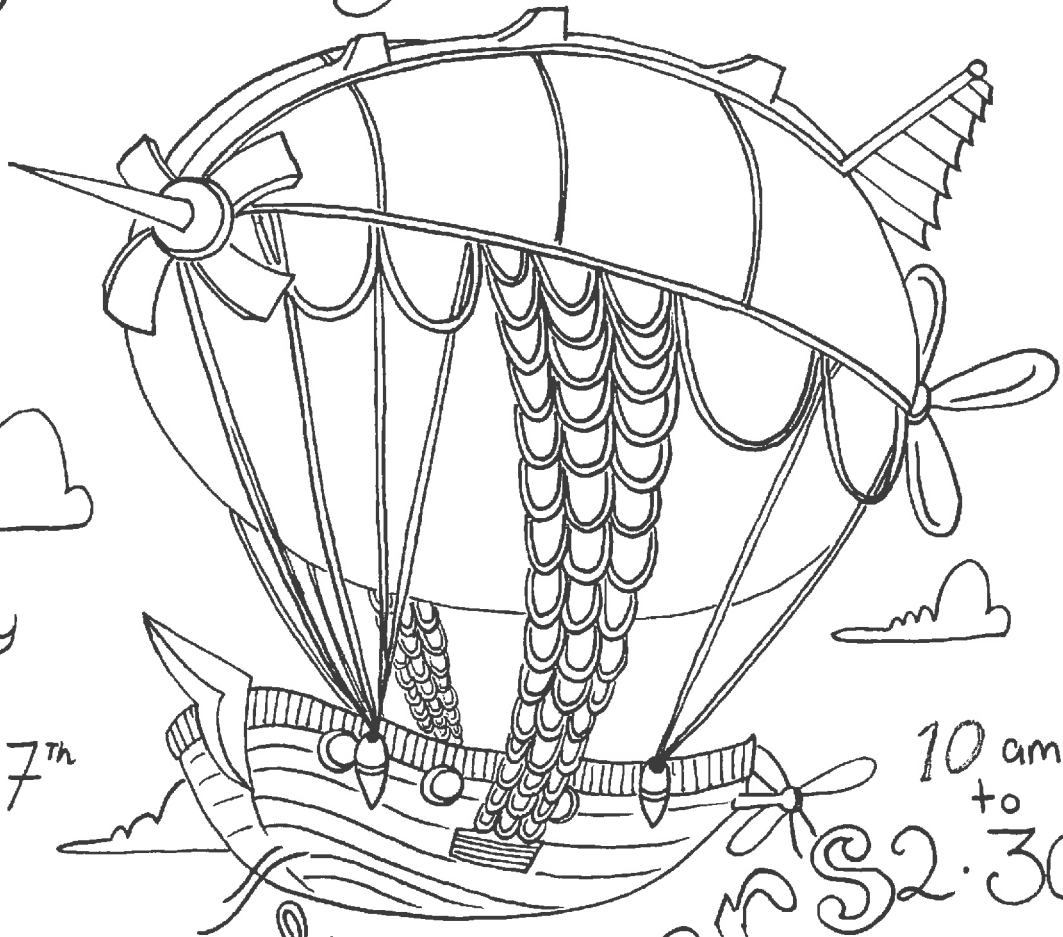
