## **TERM 2 TOPIC: SURVIVAL OF ENDANGERED ANIMALS**

This term we are going to be learning about endangered animals and how they adapt and evolve to help them survive. We will be exploring the concept of survival of the fittest. Children love learning about animals and this was one of the things they asked to learn more about when we asked them for ideas at the end of last year.

## **DUNEDIN SCHOOLS ZINE COMPETITION**

Toroa and Korimako Class have made some amazing little Zines (mini magazines) and they have all been entered into the Dunedin Writers and Readers Festival Competition for primary school age children. The standard of our school entries was amazing. The judges will be announcing the winners at a free event at the Dunedin Public Library today Friday 12<sup>th</sup> May from 3.30 – 4.30pm (in the Teen Space area). It would be great to have lots of our children from these two classes there and I am looking forward to going in too. Kate De Goldi and Paul Beavis are going to do a presentation around the theme '*anything is a story*' and show examples of where you can dig good stories up, so it won't just be an award-giving event. All the zine entries are currently on display in the Teen Space area.

## **PLAY IS THE WAY PROGRAMME- Training next week**

This coming Monday the 15<sup>th</sup> of May we are taking a large team from the Staff to work with Wilson McCaskill at Tainui School. We will have a number of known relievers in the school that day.

Wilson has developed a programme called Play is the Way. This is a philosophy of behavior education and student self- regulation that fosters independent, self-motivated, empathetic, life-long learners.

It is a practical methodology for teaching social and emotional skills using a unique programme of physically interactive games and classroom activities that both require and develop personal, social and emotional learning.

We are very keen to introduce this programme school wide as we see huge benefits in it for our children.

## **PLAY IS THE WAY PARENT EVENING: WEDNESDAY 17 MAY, 7PM**

Wilson McCaskill is going to run a parent session that you are all very welcome to attend in the Tainui School Hall if you would like to find out more. There will be gold coin donation

for entry. The session will start at 7pm and childcare will be available in the Tainui School library, as children are not included in the session with parents.

We have had parents attend these sessions in the past and they have found it hugely helpful in terms of understanding how to help their children develop social and emotional skills.

Wilson is a really special presenter and he is hugely passionate about helping children develop as people. You could see some clips on YouTube if you want to do a bit of research prior to going along.

### **YR 5 OVERNIGHT STAY AT THE MUSEUM**

We have been thinking for a while it would be great to take our Year 5 children on an overnight stay camp the year before their big Yr. 6 Camp as preparation and also a great experience for them. This year we have booked an overnight stay at the Otago Museum for the Year 5 children in Korimako Class on the 13<sup>th</sup> of June. It costs \$35 to stay at the Museum overnight and that includes dinner and breakfast. We are currently applying for a grant to help cover this cost but are still waiting to hear if we have been successful. The children would go in at 3pm, leaving school at 2.30pm on a bus and would leave the Museum at 9.30am the following morning. We have sent home information yesterday with consent forms and health profiles that need to be filled in and returned as soon as possible.

### **MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS**

For the first time we are going to take part in the Puaka / Matariki Celebrations that are taking place across the region. Mark the evening of Wednesday the 21<sup>st</sup> of June in your calendar as we plan to have a hangi tea at school and celebrate this special time of year.

We would love some help to prepare food for the hangi and to help with it on the day so if you think you could help please let us know. There will be a small charge to contribute towards the costs of the kai of \$5 per head. Also if any families had any good vegies available from their gardens to donate for the hangi that would be wonderful to know about prior to us ordering in food.

Rob Wells has been incredibly helpful from Tahuna , explaining how they do their hangi each year and Tahuna is kindly lending us their hangi baskets and irons and tongs etc

Does anybody know of a good source of manuka as that is apparently the hottest burning wood? Alternatively we will need to buy in some good dry firewood. Do we have any kind people who would help dig the two hangi pits on the Wednesday morning? There is a notice at the back of the newsletter where you can order your hangi meals and volunteer any help you may be able to offer.

We are going to ask families who want to take part in our hangi to preorder and prepay for their hangi meals.( \$5 per person). We will aim to lift the hangi at about 5pm or 5.30pm and eat shortly after.

We started last week and the children really enjoyed developing their football skills with two enthusiastic coaches.

Last year we signed up to a very useful app called PT Calendar or the Parent Teacher Calendar App. Once you have downloaded the free app to your phone you can go in and choose Otago as your region and Macandrew Bay School as your school. Once this is loaded you can then go on it to see what is coming up on the calendar, report that your child is absent (by phone, SMS or email), find contact email addresses for your child's teacher, read the latest newsletter, or read information about our school. It also allows us to send a text to any parents who are signed up to our school if we had something happen that we needed to communicate with parents about e.g. an early closing of the school if we were flooded or had some sort of emergency. We can also email all our parents in case of an emergency using etap our Student Management system, as long as we have your correct email addresses on our database.

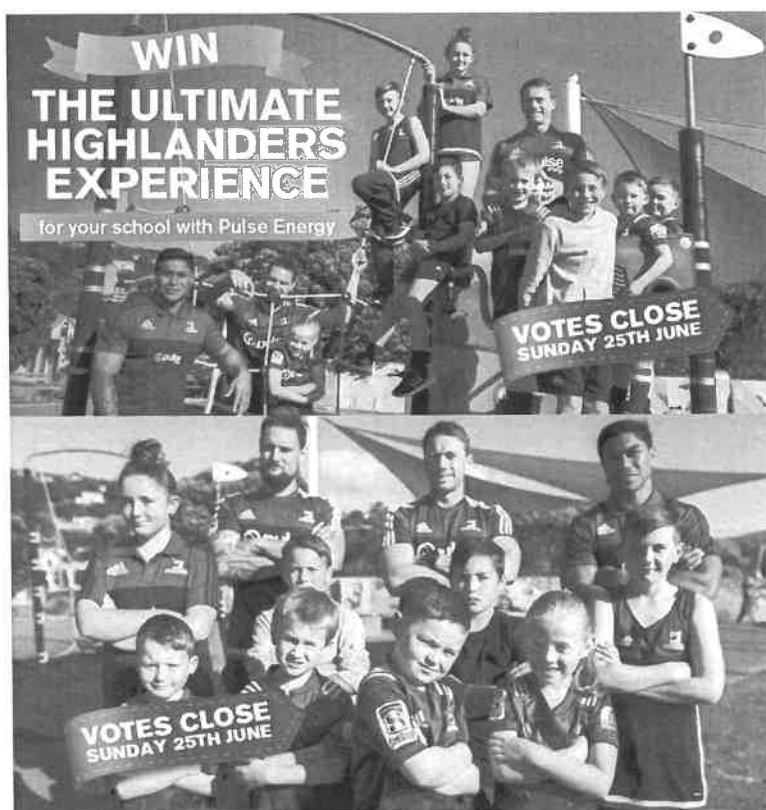

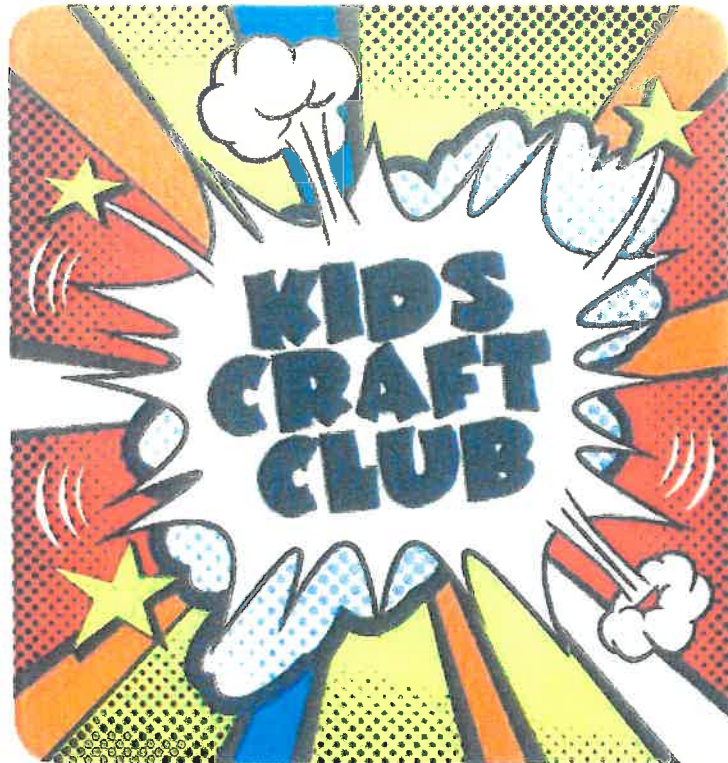
