SCHOOL MID YEAR REPORTS

The teachers have been busy writing mid year reports on each child and these will come home to parents next Friday afternoon with the children. These give information about how the children are going primarily in Reading, Writing and Maths and what their next steps are to focus on. There is a general comment that summarises their overall achievement and efforts in the first half of the year too.

The end of year reports are far more detailed and cover every curriculum area and the key competencies too but it is really good for parents to get a snapshot mid year as well so you can see how your children are going as the year progresses and get more of a steer about what they might need extra help and support with at home as well as at school.

STUDENT LEAD CONFERENCES IN PLACE OF PARENT INTERVIEWS THIS YEAR TUESDAY 27 JUNE and THURSDAY 29TH OF JUNE

We are trying something a little bit different this year in terms of Mid year meetings with parents. The main thing that came out of our very successful ERO report in 2015 was that we needed to help the children to fully understand more about themselves as learners- what they do well, where their areas of challenge are, and what they are doing to address the things they find hard to help them get better and make stronger progress. In current education speak this is referred to as learner agency.

This year we want to put our children in the driving seat to share their learning with you their parents at mid year interviews here at school, with the teachers in the room as support and to help facilitate discussions. We will be working with the children next week so they know what they are sharing with you and teachers might have a little prompt card to give parents as you arrive with some useful possible questions you might want to ask the children.

We are allowing 25 minute time slots so things won't be rushed and up to 4 children will be talking with their parents individually in corners of the classroom at one time with the teacher or teachers circulating around the various groups. With smaller classes in the Juniors there may only be one or two of you there at once which will be easier to help support the children.

SPEAKERS AT SCHOOL THIS WEEK

This week we have been lucky enough to have three of our fantastic parents come along to share some of their knowledge and passion for their subjects with the children.

On Monday Kelli Lamare came and talked about her love and concern for animals and the work she has done to ensure that animals live good lives. She talked about adopting rescue animals from the SPCA and making sure that we think about our impact on animals. She stressed that animals are sentient beings with feelings and emotions just like us and it is important that humans treat them kindly.

Ian McGee returned after his very successful talk last year and talked about his 5 favourite endangered animals from around the world on Thursday. He shared some fantastic stories about what made these animals special. The animals he brought to the children's attention were the Orangutan, the Panda, the Manatee, a type of rusty-bellied bumblebee and the Madagascan Aye-aye. We loved his Sir David Rattenborough persona and explorer outfit and the children learnt lots again.

After last term's technology project focused on building bridges we were lucky enough to have Nik Devlin, Structural Engineer, come and talk to the children today about bridges and their construction. He shared stories about specific bridges and the work that he does in his job and the children learned lots of things about bridges and how they are built. This linked in beautifully with our learning from last term.

A big thanks to these three generous people for coming along to speak.

Next week Rod Morris is going to be talking to the children too- possibly about endangered native birds.



YR 5 OVERNIGHT STAY AT THE MUSEUM THIS WEEK

We had a brilliant time at the Otago Museum on Tuesday afternoon and night and the kids seem to love being the only people still in the Museum when everybody had gone home and getting the chance to sleep in Discovery World with all their classmates. We had a full on programme spending time learning how people and animals use defense and attack strategies to survive, finding out about extinct animals from the past and fossils, visiting the Butterfly House, playing in Discovery World and also doing a treasure hunt around the Museum before it opened in the morning. We had some very tired children on Wednesday but they did very well and were a pleasure to take away.

SURVIVAL OF THE FITTEST TOPIC

The children are sharing lots of interesting research with me that they are doing into animals that are under threat and needing help to survive and adapt. I hope they have been talking about these things with you at home too. Thank you to the families that help with getting books from the library and searching for information online etc. This really supports your child or children's learning.

Understanding these issues seems even more important when we heard recently on the news that one third of our native New Zealand birds are now endangered and facing the risk of extinction. That is quite shocking to hear and hopefully is a situation that is able to be reversed.

PASSION PROJECTS

Today we started a three week programme where each teacher is going to plan and teach a series of three lessons in a subject that they are passionate about and work as much as possible with children who enjoy this subject too. We do need to have manageable sized groups though so will even the groups up.

Mr Mitchell will do Music, Miss Brown- Kapahaka. Mr Direen -Science experiments, Mrs B- Art related creative activities, Mrs Ward –Art (Fence Mural Painting), Mrs Wells-STEM (Science Technology, Engineering, Maths), Miss Hutchison - Drama .

The children will all be in mixed age groups. The Kapahaka group will be the children who are normally in Muaupoko and their learning will be the start of their Polyfest Preparation for the performance that is coming up next term.

HEADLICE

We have had some parents calling to let us know that head lice are appearing in their children's hair.

Could you all please check your child and treat for head lice if necessary. If your child does have head lice please remember that they should stay away from class until they have been treated.

WINTER WEATHER AFFECTING SCHOOL STARTING TIMES ETC

Well I guess now that we are in June it is timely to remind families what might happen if the weather turns particularly nasty and snow or ice make the roads so dangerous that schools around the city need to be delayed till 10am or closed for the day.

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations. It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made is that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school

and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

Keep on looking as we can only do that once we have heard the city wide decision. It is great if you hear school is off that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school. We will also attempt to send all families an email so check your emails too.

MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS- HANGI – NEXT WEDNESDAY

For the first time we are going to take part in the Puaka / Matariki Celebrations that are taking place across the region. Mark the evening of Wednesday the 21st of June in your calendar as we plan to have a hangi tea at school and celebrate this special time of year.

We would love some help to prepare food for the hangi and to help with it on the day so if you think you could help please let us know. We hope to prepare the vegetables and meat on Wednesday morning, starting at 9am and would really appreciate any help people can offer. Come along with a potato peeler and we will happily give you a job on Wednesday morning. It would be great if children in Toroa and Korimako classes might bring a potato peeler in their lunch box too as they might help with preparing the kumara, potatoes and carrots.

We expect there might be about 200 meals to prepare as orders needed to be in to the office with the money today, this will be a really great number taking part in this special meal together. Also if any families had any good vegies available from their gardens to donate for the hangi that would be wonderful to know about prior to us ordering in food so let Liz Luscombe know or tell us at school.

Rob Wells (Mrs Wells husband) has been incredibly helpful from Tahuna, explaining how they do their hangi each year and Tahuna is kindly lending us their hangi baskets and irons and tongs etc. We are grateful that Rob is able to help us on the day too as well as Tony Evans from Harwood, and some of our wonderful parents. Ron Bull, Simon Kaan's friend is also coming so we will have a great team on hand.

What we really need to source now is some old sheets of corrugated iron. We need 7 bits about 2 metres long. If anybody has some old roofing iron we could borrow we would love to hear from you. Liz Luscombe has done a great job of sourcing the sacks and sheets we need so that is all sorted now. In fact Liz has done a wonderful job working away getting us prepared and sorting the orders etc. Thank you so much Liz.

Thank you to Tony Reid for his offer of firewood and Jo Lewis for the Lamb donated. That is a great help and is gratefully accepted. Also Stu Urbahn, one of our parents and the Manager from the Sth Dunedin Countdown has been wonderful in donating some of the kai we need and giving us a great deal on the rest of the food. Thank you so much to our wonderful parents!

We have some kind people who are going to help dig the hangi pits on the Wednesday morning. The hangi is going to be done up near Conway Street near the tank behind the Junior Block. We thought if we started digging about 7.30am we would get the digging done and then have plenty of time to get the fire all set up. If we get the fire going at about

10am then the irons should be hot enough to put the hangi down about 1pm. If we dig the hangi pits a day or two before and it rains we could get water in our pits and we don't want hangi soup! That's why we are leaving the digging till Wednesday morning.

We will aim to lift the hangi at about 5pm or 5.30pm and eat shortly after. We would love it if you could bring your own plates and cutlery to eat off and take your dishes home afterwards to keep things as simple as possible. We will serve the food down by the entrance to the Senior Block and then we can eat in the Learning Street and gather later in the Library/ Tutahi area.

It will be fun to do a lantern procession around the school after we eat and have a story about Matariki in Tutahi so for those who would like to do this can you make a lantern at home and bring it along. Some of you may have them already from the Lantern Festival that occurs in the city each year.

We are also very excited because Tony Tarasiewicz has been working with Trent Carmody and they are going to do a firesticks demonstration to finish the evening off.

FUTURE ENROLMENTS AT MACANDREW BAY SCHOOL

We need to have up to date information about children who are likely to attend our school in the future and so if you have a pre-school child or know of a neighbour or a friend with a child who plans to send them here in the next few years then please get them to ring or email the school with the child's name, date of birth, address and parent's contact phone number. That would be really helpful for us in planning for the future.

We are particularly keen to find out if there are any New Entrants likely to start in Term 4 this year as at the moment it looks like we don't have any children turning 5 then which seems rather unusual.

Children usually start coming along for valuable pre- school visits to the New Entrant classroom about 6 weeks before they are due to start and this helps them transition successfully to school. Get in touch with us here at school about 2 months prior to your child's birthday to get this all arranged.

SOCCER COACHING AT SCHOOL

Football South are sending football coaches to school to work with each class for ½ hour each Friday for some weeks this term when the weather is suitable. Sadly there has been lots of rain on Fridays so far this term but they have been here the last couple of weeks.

The children are really enjoying developing their football skills with one or two enthusiastic coaches. They are mostly Irish coaches and they have been a pleasure to work with.

POLYFEST AND STARS ON STAGE IN TERM 3

Next term is going to be a busy and exciting term for many of our children with the Year 4 - 6 pupils all being involved in Stars on Stage (a Dance performance at the Regent Theatre) and also Polyfest at the Edgar Stadium.

We are starting this week to prepare our Kapahaka group for Polyfest and this will amp up more next term in preparation for the Maori and Pasific Island Festival that is a wonderful occasion each year. The three schools on the Peninsula usually combine together to do Polyfest but this year we are all going it alone, though I would hope we might be back together next year perhaps.

We are taking the theme of the Jungle Book Story for our Stars on Stage theme and each Senior class will have their own section of the dance to prepare. This should flow on nicely from our focus on Animals this term.

VOLUNTARY SCHOOL DONATIONS

Last year we signed up to a very useful app called PT Calendar or the Parent Teacher Calendar App. Once you have downloaded the free app to your phone you can go in and choose Otago as your region and Macandrew Bay School as your school. Once this is loaded you can then go on it to see what is coming up on the calendar, report that your child is absent (by phone, SMS or email), find contact email addresses for your child's teacher, read the latest newsletter, or read information about our school. It also allows us to send a text to any parents who are signed up to our school if we had something happen that we needed to communicate with parents about e.g. an early closing of the school if we were flooded or had some sort of emergency. We can also email all our parents in case of an emergency using etap our Student Management system, as long as we have your correct email addresses on our database.

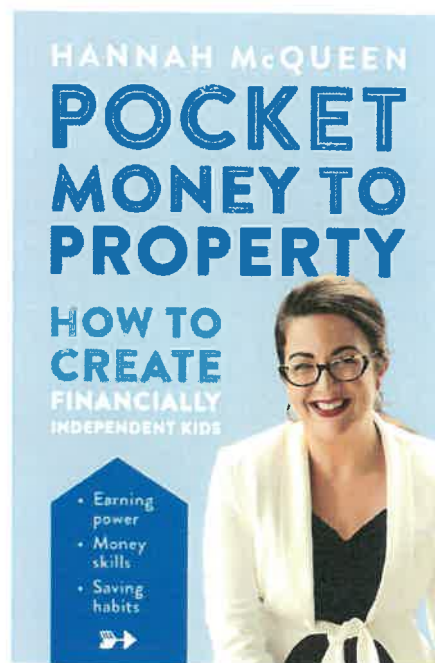

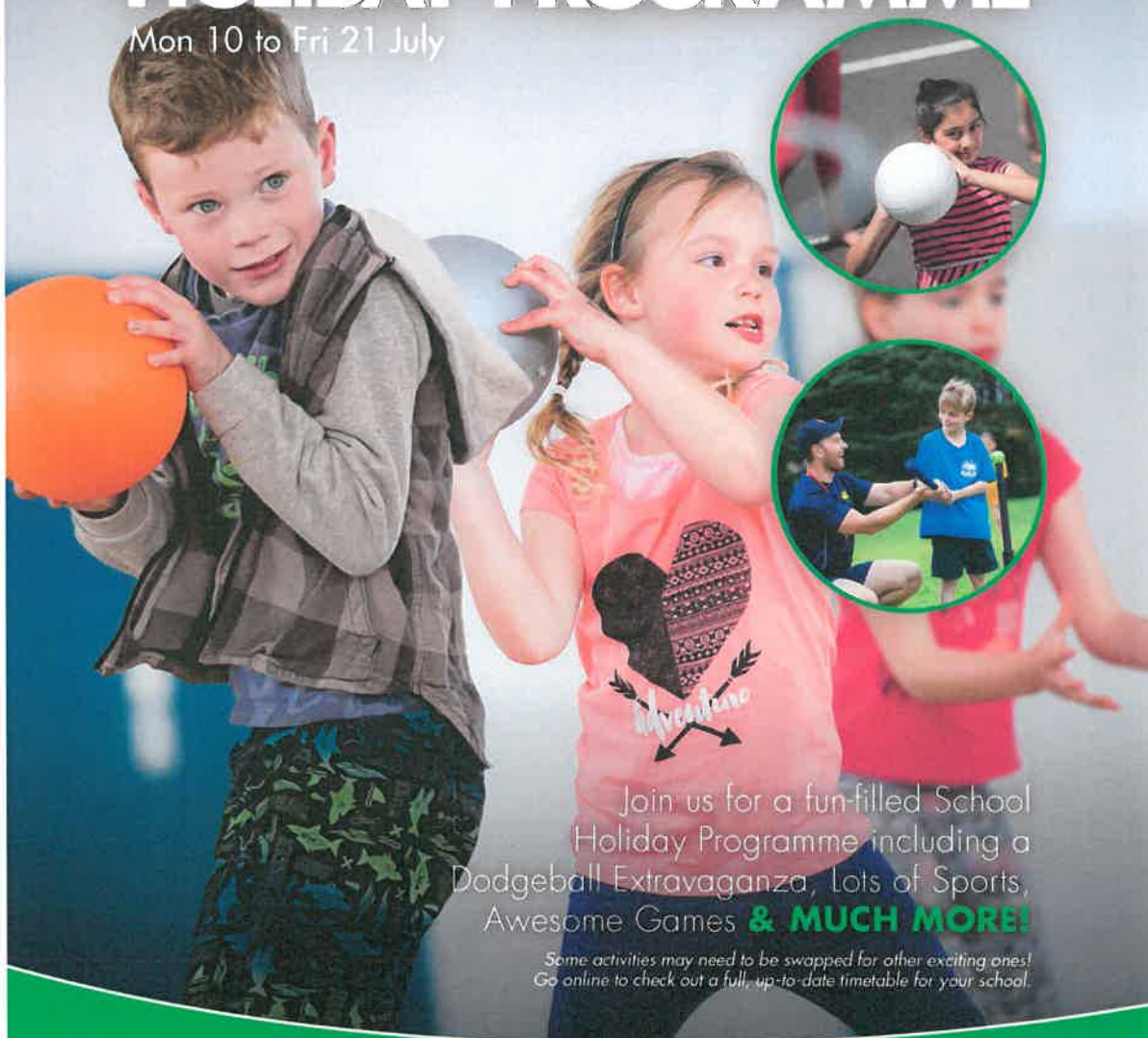



- this is an example of a locative sentence

Rama and Pita are *meeting* in the library.

- this is an example of an active sentence
