Kia ora koutou katoa,  
Greetings Parents and Caregivers

We have had a pleasant, warm week at school this week and it has been great to see all the children having lots of fun playing outside in the beautiful March sunshine at playtime and lunchtime. We will be closed on Monday to observe Otago Anniversary Day so let's hope the pleasant autumn weather continues on into the weekend.

## **SPORT OTAGO TRIATHLON EVENT**

We were very excited to hear how very well our children did at the Sport Otago Primary Schools Triathlon on Wednesday this week. The event was held over in Port Chalmers and eighteen keen and excited Macandrew Bay Year 5 and 6 pupils took part. We had some teams competing as well as some individual competitors doing all three events.

Dan O'Brien did extremely well winning the Year 5 Boys event by a big margin with Jacob Levy coming second. Katie Moore came 5<sup>th</sup> in the Year 6 Girls event. Our teams also did well with the Year 6 Girls coming 9<sup>th</sup> and the Year 5 Girls coming 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Year 5 boys teams also finished 9<sup>th</sup> and the Year 6 Boys teams had a team in 6<sup>th</sup> place and the other came 9<sup>th</sup> also.

We definitely have some children who have qualified to compete in the Otago Primary Schools Triathlon Event in Cromwell on April the 5<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Direen will let these children know more when Sport Otago have confirmed who qualified.

Thank you Mr. Direen for organizing our participation in the event and for your coordination on the day and also to all the parents who helped with transport and with getting the bikes and children to the event on Wednesday. Mr. Direen was very impressed with the resilience the children showed in hot conditions. Those children who took a tumble got straight back up to their feet and carried on competing.

## **PARENT ASSEMBLY DATES THIS TERM**

We hold two assemblies a term on a Friday afternoon and invite all parents and whanau to come along and see what the children have to share from their recent weeks learning at school. The assemblies are held here at School in our Library/Hub space that we call Tutahi (a place where we stand together)

The Assemblies start at 2.20pm. One class introduces all the items and runs the assembly. Three classes have a more in depth sharing and the other three classes perform a song or two together. These roles are swapped around over the course of the year. The next Parent Assembly date will be Friday 7<sup>th</sup> April with Tui class leading the assembly.

## **MANDARIN LANGUAGE CLASSES**

Korimako and Karearea classes have started their Mandarin learning classes. We have a Mandarin Teaching Assistant from Tahuna who comes out to all the Peninsula Schools and delivers brief fun lessons each week that deliver a bit of language and a bit of learning about Chinese culture and traditions. Korimako class are carrying on their learning from last year and Karearea class are starting as beginners. Research show learning languages is very good for children's brains and it is great fun too.

## **WHANAU HUI**

We are organizing our Term 1 Whanau Hui for Wednesday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March. We would love to invite the whanau from our children who identify as Maori along to an afternoon tea and an informal chat with staff representatives. We enjoy talking about what we can do at school and we get some great ideas out of these get-togethers. If you haven't been along to one yet see if you might be able to make it along to the one coming up on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. We have a cup of tea, some afternoon tea kai and the children are welcome too.

## **SWIMMING**

Next week will be our last week of school swimming this year before the pool is closed for the season at Otago Anniversary Weekend to the Community. (The last day for the pool for school swimming lessons will be on Wednesday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March). Please send your child along prepared to swim with their togs and a towel etc on Tuesday and Wednesday next week.

Remember if your child has had a tummy bug they can't swim for two weeks after vomiting or diarrhea as otherwise it could spread to others.

## **SWIMMING POOL KEYS**

I hope you have enjoyed your access to the pool if you bought a School pool key this year. The \$10.00 bond refunds will be available at the office when you return your key. Can you please start bringing your keys back after Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March and Irene can give you your \$10 refunds then.

Many thanks to Joni Simpson and Amanda Brown for the great work they do in overseeing the pool sorting out the chemicals, setting up the rosters and checking continually that all is going well. Without them our pool would grind to a standstill. Thanks to all the families who took their turn, went on the roster and did the pool checks. We really appreciate your help and time.

## **KIDS LIT QUIZ**

I have been working with 12 of the children from Year 5 and 6 who are very keen readers and we have been preparing and getting ready to take part in the Otago Kids Lit Quiz to be held at DNI in their hall on the 29<sup>th</sup> of March from 11am-2pm. This is the first time we have had the opportunity to enter Yr. 5 and 6 children and we will have three teams taking part.

## **SCHOOL DISCO- 24 MARCH- 6pm-8pm**

The fantastic Home and School parents are organizing a School Disco at the Macandrew

Bay Hall on Friday the 24 March between 6pm and 8pm. All children are welcome to come and parents too. It is an alcohol free event for the adults. The children have lots of fun at the Disco; Magic Kids are again providing us with the sound system and a DJ for the evening at no cost.

It costs \$5 per child to go to the Disco and for that the children get entry to the Disco, a drink, packet of chips and usually a glow stick too.

### **ROAD SAFETY VEST**

We would love to see all our children wearing their road safety vests if they are walking, biking or scootering to and from school. They would be much safer if this was the case!

### **TENNIS COACHING**

On Wednesday all our Yr. 2- Yr. 6 children started half hour tennis coaching lessons with two tennis coaches. They learned how to do forehand and backhand and how to hold their rackets. These lessons will occur at school for 4 weeks in total this term.

### **ARCHAEOLOGY TALK**

Next week we are looking forward to having Karen Greig come along to speak to the children about the work that archaeologists do and the tools they use as they uncover and learn about the past. Karen is Jamie Garlick's mum and we really appreciate her coming along to talk to our children.

### **INQUIRY THEMES – 2017**

Our big overarching concept in 2017 is about Challenge and Survival.

In Term 1 our topic is 'Ancient Civilisations- their Rise and Fall' and we will be researching a number of Civilisations and their history.

In Term 2 we will find out about the Animals and the challenges they face to survive – We will look into the concept of survival of the fittest and how it applies to the animal world.

In Term 3 we plan to look at Nature's Forces and how people deal with challenges when coping with Natural Disasters.

In Term 4 we will look into how people keep themselves safe. We will look into how we accept challenge in our lives but keep ourselves safe too.

These ideas and Inquiry topics have all come out of our consultation with the children at the end of last year when we brainstormed all the things they wanted to find out about and looked for themes that connected with these ideas.

If we have any parents or contacts that people know of who have a passion for any of these topics we would love to hear from you and see if you might possibly share your interest and knowledge with the children. They love listening to adults talking about something that they are passionate about.

## **USEFUL APP FOR YOUR PHONE THAT HELPS WITH COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL**

Last year we signed up to a very useful app called PT Calendar or the Parent Teacher Calendar App. Once you have downloaded the free app to your phone you can go in and choose Otago as your region and Macandrew Bay School as your school. Once this is loaded you can then go on it to see what is coming up on the calendar, report that your child is absent (by phone, SMS or email), find contact email addresses for your child's teacher, read the latest newsletter, or read information about our school. It also allows us to send a text to any parents who are signed up to our school if we had something happen that we needed to communicate with parents about e.g. an early closing of the school if we were flooded or had some sort of emergency. We can also email all our parents in case of an emergency using etap our Student Management system, as long as we have your correct email addresses on our database.

Thank you to the local businesses who are advertising on the PTC Calendar app and helping bring this useful service to us at no charge.

## **SUNHATS**

All children need to have a named sunhat to wear at school during Term 1 and 4. It is best that this is a wide brimmed hat. We do have school sunhats available for sale for \$10 each.

## **VOLUNTARY SCHOOL DONATIONS**

Each year we ask for a Voluntary School Donation each term and this money is used to buy reading books, maths equipment, musical instruments, sports equipment, library books and help provide Teacher Aide Support for the children in the classes. Being a Decile 10 School means our operational funds are not all that generous. Our suggested School Donations this year will be the same amount as last year - \$25.00 per term or \$100.00 per child. You are more than welcome to pay these per term or for the whole year – whichever suits you. Some parents have set up regular small direct debit contributions and that is fine. It is worth parents knowing that the receipt you receive for any donations made to school can be used for an income tax credit from Inland Revenue. You can pay school donations by internet banking but it is great if you also email and let us know you have done that and then Irene can keep track of all these payments. You need to state clearly your child's name and what the money is for in the reference information.

## **VOLUNTARY ACTIVITY DONATION**

The suggested Activity Donation again is \$10.00 per child per term, or you may wish to pay \$40.00 for the whole year. This money is used to help cover the costs of the children travelling to the Museum, Art Gallery, Sports Events and pays for visits to school by different performing groups etc. Please fill in the form below and return to the Office if you are able to contribute in this way.

## **VEGETABLE GARDENS AND STREAM PROJECT**

We realise we really need some help from members of our School Community with our vegetable gardens and stream area to keep them thriving, productive and well cared for.

Apparently the convolvulus is taking off over there, though it is great to see how well the plants are doing since we planted them 2 or 3 years ago.

### **HOME AND SCHOOL COMMITTEE**

Our first Home and School Committee meeting for the year was held this week on Thursday and it was great to have lots of familiar and new faces along to join the team this year. Next term we will have the annual Quiz night on Thursday the 25<sup>th</sup> of May.

Everybody is welcome to join the Home and School Committee and we love having new members. The meetings last an hour and start at 7pm. It is a great way to get involved with your child's School. Our next Home and School Meeting will be on Thursday the 11<sup>th</sup> of May at 7pm.

Liz Luscombe has now set up a roster for the school sausage sizzles and emailed it out to everybody who volunteered, so thank you. That will be great to get your help in this way.

### **Information about our Home and School Committee**

The Home & School Committee meets twice a term and is a less formally organised group than the Board of Trustees. They support the school in many matters outside the curriculum such as fundraising for special projects and holding events. It is a good opportunity for every new parent to meet other parents, make close contact with teachers and get a better understanding about the everyday life at school. All meetings are open to every parent and the committee always welcomes new members. How much work every member wants to contribute in the end is entirely up to them. The aim is no pressure but lots of fun. The meetings are announced in the weekly newsletters. We usually have a Fair every two years and in alternate years we hold an Art Auction to raise funds for Arts programmes in the school and to fund our 'Artist in School' programme. This year we are due to run the Art Auction as our major fundraiser for the year.

## **IMPETAGO (SCHOOL SORES)**

From time to time this can pop up in the community and in schools, and because it is passed by handling shared equipment it can spread quickly. There is usually 7-10 days between being exposed to showing a rash or showing scabs on the face or hands. If you are not sure if your child has this it is best to get it checked out. They may need antibiotics and treatment. The best way to prevent the spread of impetigo is lots of careful hand washing and not touching your face. They should not come back to school till at least 24 hours after treatment has started or whatever your doctor has advised.

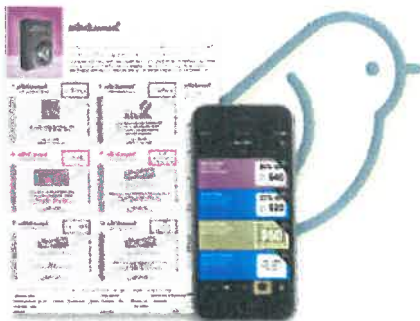

Take the clothes outside so that they can be *shone* on by the sun.

- this is an example of a passive sentence
- this example uses "ai" for additional information
