### **PLAY IS THE WAY PROGRAMME-**

On Monday this week we took a large team from the staff to work with Wilson McCaskill at Tainui School.

Wilson has developed a programme called Play is the Way. This is a philosophy of behavior education and student self-regulation that fosters independent, self-motivated, empathetic, life-long learners.

It is a practical methodology for teaching social and emotional skills using a unique programme of physically interactive games and classroom activities that both require and develop personal, social and emotional learning.

We are very keen to introduce this programme school wide as we see huge benefits in it for our children. Some of our parents went along to the Parent session on Wednesday night and will have found that provided lots of useful insights too.

### **YR 5 OVERNIGHT STAY AT THE MUSEUM-13 June**

We have been thinking for a while it would be great to take our Year 5 children on an overnight stay camp the year before their big Yr. 6 Camp as preparation and also a great experience for them. This year we have booked an overnight stay at the Otago Museum for the Year 5 children in Korimako Class on the 13<sup>th</sup> of June. It costs \$35 to stay at the Museum overnight and that includes dinner and breakfast. We are currently applying for a grant to help cover this cost but are still waiting to hear if we have been successful. The children would go in at 3pm, leaving school at 2.30pm on a bus and would leave the Museum at 9.30am the following morning. We have sent home information with consent forms and health profiles that need to be filled in and returned as soon as possible.

### **MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS- HANGI**

For the first time we are going to take part in the Puaka / Matariki Celebrations that are taking place across the region. Mark the evening of Wednesday the 21<sup>st</sup> of June in your calendar as we plan to have a hangi tea at school and celebrate this special time of year.

We would love some help to prepare food for the hangi and to help with it on the day so if you think you could help please let us know. There will be a small charge to contribute towards the costs of the kai of \$5 per head. Also if any families had any good vegies available from their gardens to donate for the hangi that would be wonderful to know about prior to us ordering in food.

Rob Wells has been incredibly helpful from Tahuna, explaining how they do their hangi each year and Tahuna is kindly lending us their hangi baskets and irons and tongs etc

Thank you to Tony Reid and Chris Fenwick for their offers of firewood. That is a great help. Do we have any kind people who would help dig the two hangi pits on the Wednesday morning? We would also love some help to prepare the vegetables if that is possible please?

There is a notice at the back of the newsletter where you can order your hangi meals and volunteer any help you may be able to offer.

We are going to ask families who want to take part in our hangi to preorder and prepay for their hangi meals. ( \$5 per person). That way we know exactly how much food to prepare and buy in. We will aim to lift the hangi at about 5pm or 5.30pm and eat shortly after.

It would be fun to do a lantern procession after we eat around the school so for those who would like to do this can you make a lantern at home and bring it along. Some of you may have them already from the Lantern Festival that occurs in the city each year.

Last year we signed up to a very useful app called PT Calendar or the Parent Teacher Calendar App. Once you have downloaded the free app to your phone you can go in and choose Otago as your region and Macandrew Bay School as your school. Once this is loaded you can then go on it to see what is coming up on the calendar, report that your child is absent (by phone, SMS or email), find contact email addresses for your child's teacher, read the latest newsletter, or read information about our school. It also allows us to send a text to any parents who are signed up to our school if we had something happen that we needed to communicate with parents about e.g. an early closing of the school if we were flooded or had some sort of emergency. We can also email all our parents in case of an emergency using etap our Student Management system, as long as we have your correct email addresses on our database.

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## Project Manager

The Otago Peninsula Biodiversity Group (OPBG) was established in 2008, when a small group of individuals came together out of a shared desire to enhance and protect the natural values of the Otago Peninsula. Planning and community consultation was undertaken and the flagship 'possum eradication project' established. Since that time the OPBG has killed over 11,000 possums, developed community trapping programmes, vegetation, bird, rodent and lizard monitoring programmes and engaged with landowners across the Peninsula. OPBG has gained significant local and national media coverage for its work, and has established trusted partnerships with Government agencies, local authorities and NGOs in the process. The activities of OPBG are managed by the Otago Peninsula Biodiversity Trust, a registered charitable trust.

OPBG is seeking to engage a part-time Project Manager to lead this project. The appointee will be responsible for the overall direction, coordination, implementation, execution, control and completion of specific sub-projects, consistent with OPBG strategies, commitments and goals.

The focus of OPBG is on projects which will achieve a pest-free Peninsula.

1. Lead, motivate and involve the wider Peninsula community, including urban residents, rural landowners, volunteers, and other individuals and groups, to achieve a pest-free Peninsula.

- Proven ability to manage staff, contractors and volunteers.

## TO WHĀNAU PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS

### ENROLMENT SCHEME FOR TAHUNA NORMAL INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL

The Ministry of Education requires the Board of Trustees to implement an enrolment scheme in accordance with section 11H of the Education Act 1989, to avoid overcrowding at the school.

As part of this process, we need to consult with our school community, the wider community and neighbouring schools. The Board has prepared a proposed zone as a basis for consultation. That proposal is set out in the attached map and explanation. A larger version is on display in the school office.

The introduction of an enrolment scheme will not affect children who are currently enrolled at Tahuna Normal Intermediate School, they will continue to be enrolled at the school. ("Currently enrolled" means that the child is enrolled at and has started attending Tahuna Normal Intermediate School when the scheme becomes effective.)

For children who have not yet enrolled at Tahuna Normal Intermediate School when the scheme comes into effect, the enrolment scheme means that:

If they live in the zone, they will have the right to enrol at Tahuna Normal Intermediate School

If the Board of Trustees enforces the the enrollment scheme and they live outside the zone, they will only be able to enrol at Tahuna Normal Intermediate School if there are places available in their year group. If more children wish to enrol than there are places available, the Education Act says that places must be offered to children in the following order of priority:

1. Students accepted for enrolment in a special programme run by the school and approved by the Secretary of Education (this does not apply to Tahuna Normal Intermediate School).
2. Siblings of current students.
3. Siblings of former students.
4. Children of former students
5. Children of staff and board members.
6. All other students

If more children within any one of these priority groups wish to enrol than there are places available, the Board must conduct a ballot to determine who is offered a place.

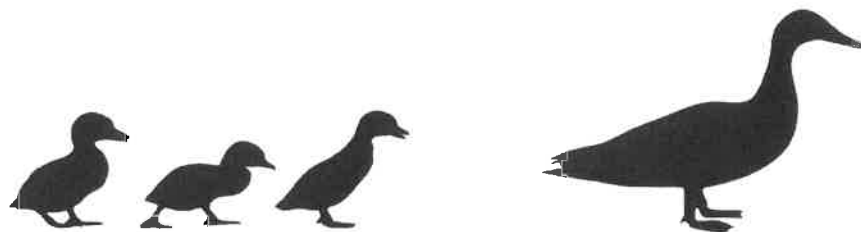

## Head Lice Facts

Head lice are a common problem throughout the World. They are highly contagious and are easily picked up on contact with others that are infested or their personal belongings.

### Head Lice...

- Are small, flat insects about 2-3mm long (the size of a sesame seed)
- Live on the human scalp
- Breed all year round
- Are normally grey/brown in colour
- Cannot jump, fly or swim
- Do not carry disease
- Remain on the head after swimming or showering

## What To Look For

For school age children check for head lice once a week. You will not need to do this if you are using Nit-Enz Organic Shampoo twice a week, as recommended.

Check the whole scalp for insects and their eggs, especially:

- Around the hair line and at the back of the neck
- Behind the ears
- On the crown of the head

## Life Cycle

Female lice lay about 7 - 10 eggs each night, close to the scalp. Eggs are glued firmly onto the hair shaft, no more than 1cm from the scalp. They are normally a grey/brown colour and are difficult to see (prior to shampooing with Nit-Enz). Eggs hatch every 7 - 10 days and a louse can live for 40 days.

The only reaction that has ever been reported was a hot rash brought about by a pine allergy. If a rash occurs simply rinse with cold water and do not use.

The whole family should be treated at the same time! The adults should only have to do this once. Bed linen, sun hats, jackets and any other clothing in contact with the infested person's head should be washed with a squirt of Nit-Enz added to the wash. Hair brushes, hair ties and combs should be soaked in hot water with a squirt of Nit-Enz diluted in it for the duration of the treatment.

If head lice have been present for a while there will be bites and scratches on the scalp and the first time the shampoo is applied it will sting as it is similar to putting Dettol on a cut. Wet the hair and thoroughly smother the scalp, behind the ears, along the neck line and right through to the hair tips with Nit-Enz Organic Shampoo.

Put hair up and cover with glad wrap or a shower cap for about 20 minutes. We say 20 minutes because head lice can hold their breath for nearly 20 minutes but it doesn't matter if it's a bit less or a bit more as the eggs will be effected on contact.

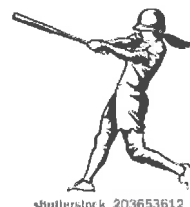
