## **ROD MORRIS –VISITING SPEAKER**

The children loved learning more about a subject that is quite dear to their hearts and they had really great questions and prior knowledge to bring to the topic. It is always great listening to Rod and we are very lucky that he so willingly and kindly comes along to speak to us when we ask him.

## **JOSH- FLOW ARTS**

We invited Josh to come along to speak to our Focus Assembly this week to demonstrate his love for and skills with the poi and staff used in Flow Arts.

Josh has some funding from the Ministry of Social Development to work in schools and so we are inviting Josh to come to our school on Tuesday lunchtimes to run a lunchtime playground activity learning how to use the starter equipment and to start picking up some Flow arts skills.

The children were impressed and are looking forward to having a go at these things themselves. We are purchasing some of the equipment so we will have some school sets of poi and staff.

It was exciting on Wednesday night to see some of our local children have started doing these things already under Tony Tarasiewicz guidance so we already have some children in the school who will be our leaders in this field.

## **MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS- HANGI HELD THIS WEDNESDAY**

For the first time our school took part in the Puaka / Matariki Celebrations that are currently taking place across the region. We had an absolutely magical, special day at school this Wednesday where we got to experience our own hangi at school and then had a really fun evening at school where a huge crowd of whanau got to enjoy the hangi together and the evenings activities.

There were about 250 meals prepared and this was a really superb number of people taking part in this special meal together. The food was absolutely delicious, in fact I thought it was the best hangi food I had ever tried. For many families it was their first chance to try hangi food while others were old hands and had lots of knowledge to share.

We had heaps of help to put down the hangi and to prepare food for the hangi on the day

with a wonderful team all turning up and helping out throughout Wednesday from about 7.15am onwards. The children in Toroa got stuck in with their potato peelers and got the carrots done in no time too. Thank you to Teremoana Marsh, Tori Black, Jo Lewis, Sarah Wood, Janelle Urbahn, Kerrie Elder and Kelli Lamare and Liz Luscombe for all the food prep in the morning.

Rob Wells (Mrs Wells husband) has been very helpful from Tahuna, and Tahuna kindly lent us their hangi baskets and irons and tongs and corrugated iron etc. We are grateful that Rob was able to help us on the day too as well as Tony Evans from Harwood, and some of our wonderful parents Jason Marsh and Simon Kaan. Ron Bull, Simon Kaan's friend also came so we certainly had the A team on hand to ensure the hangi was a great success.

A big thanks to our hangi pit diggers who helped early in the morning too- Matt Harcombe, Rhys Latton, Rene Van Baalen, Niels Kjaegaard and to Chris Fenwick who helped the guys lift the hangi in the evening.

Liz Luscombe did a really wonderful job working away in the weeks prior getting us prepared with everything we needed for the hangi, sorting the things we needed, the orders, and volunteers and working away tirelessly on the day. Thank you so much Liz for all the effort you put in to make our hangi day so successful.

Thank you to Tony Reid for the firewood, Jo Lewis and Wal O' Neill for the lamb roasts they donated, Hannah Lawrence for potatoes from her garden, Tony Tarasiewicz for the lovely yams and Adealaide Peihopa for the beautiful Rewena bread that was such a hit. We are incredibly grateful to Stu Urbahn, one of our parents and the Manager from the Sth Dunedin Countdown who was absolutely wonderful in donating heaps of the kai we needed and giving us a great deal on the rest of the food. Thank you so much to our wonderful parents! I think our school is so lucky to have the backing of its wonderful parent community who are so generous with their time, energy and skills and talents.

Speaking of talented people we were lucky enough to have Jessica Latton work with a group of our tamariki to perform a story about a family experiencing a Matariki Whanau gathering and learning about some of the stories about the Matariki stars. Jessica worked with the 8 children involved on Wednesday and they did a lovely job of being part of the story re-enactment with her. It was beautiful to have the spirit and emotions of Matariki made explicit through Jessica's story and beautiful performance. It was fun to do a lantern procession around the school after the story with Jessica leading the way with her drum beating out beautiful rhythms. Jacqui Hay brought along lots of her beautiful lanterns to share and helped with the lantern procession as did Monica Rodriguez so it looked quite impressive as we moved around the school, waving our lanterns in the darkness and playing our instruments.

We loved having talented members of the community share their Flow Arts as well. Tony Tarasiewicz has been working with Trent Carmody and Nova and Reid Lang and it was very cool to see them do a firesticks demonstration to finish the evening off, just prior to us all joining together to sing Tutira mai nga iwi to complete a very special event.

We all went home happy and looking forward to doing it all again some time in the future.

## **SCHOOL MID YEAR REPORTS**

The teachers have been busy writing mid year reports on each child and these will come home to parents today, Friday afternoon with the children. These give information about how the children are going primarily in Reading, Writing and Maths and what their next

steps are to focus on. There is a general comment that summarises their overall achievement and efforts in the first half of the year too.

The end of year reports are far more detailed and cover every curriculum area and the key competencies too but it is really good for parents to get a snapshot mid year as well so you can see how your children are going as the year progresses and get more of a steer about what they might need extra help and support with at home as well as at school.

Although we put high value on every area of the curriculum, including the Arts, PE, Science, Social Sciences, Maori and other languages, Technology, Health etc in the interests of making written reporting more manageable for the teachers we focus on Literacy and Numeracy mid year along with attitudes, effort, social and relational skills and do everything at the end of the year.

### **OTAGO SPELLING QUIZ**

We entered and prepared three teams to take part in the Otago Spelling Quiz that was held in at Tahuna Intermediate Hall this past Wednesday the 21<sup>st</sup> of June. **STUDENT LEAD CONFERENCES IN PLACE OF PARENT INTERVIEWS THIS YEAR**  
**TUESDAY 27 JUNE and THURSDAY 29<sup>TH</sup> OF JUNE**

We are trying something a little bit different this year in terms of Mid year meetings with parents. The main thing that came out of our very successful ERO report in 2015 was that we needed to help the children to fully understand more about themselves as learners-

what they do well, where their areas of challenge are, and what they are doing to address the things they find hard to help them get better and make stronger progress. In current education speak this is referred to as learner agency.

This year we want to put our children in the driving seat to share their learning with you their parents at mid year interviews here at school, with the teachers in the room as support and to help facilitate discussions. We have been working with the children this week so they know what they are sharing with you and teachers might have a little prompt card to give parents as you arrive with some useful possible questions you might want to ask the children.

We are allowing 25 minute time slots so things won't be rushed and up to 4 children will be talking with their parents individually in corners of the classroom at one time with the teacher or teachers circulating around the various groups. With smaller classes in the Juniors there may only be one or two of you there at once which will be easier to help support the children.

You can book your time slot in the usual way by going to the website [www.schoolinterviews.co.nz](http://www.schoolinterviews.co.nz) and enter the code **kypkm**. If you are unable to book online contact Irene in the Office and she will make a booking for you.

Obviously with this format the children are essential so they need to come with you. If any parents feel they also need a private chat with the teacher talk to your child's teacher and see if you can set up a separate time after school.

### **PASSION PROJECTS**

We are underway with a three week programme where each teacher is planning and teaching a series of three lessons in a subject that they are passionate about and we have worked as much as possible to put children who enjoy this subject in with them. We do need to have manageable sized groups though so have evened the groups up.

Mr Mitchell is doing Music, Miss Brown- Kapahaka. Mr Direen -Science experiments, Mrs B-Art related creative activities, Mrs Ward –Art ( Fence Mural Painting), Mrs Wells-STEM ( Science Technology, Engineering, Maths), Miss Hutchison - Drama .

The children are in mixed age groups. The Kapahaka group will be the children who are normally in Muaupoko and their learning will be the start of their Polyfest Preparation for the performance that is coming up next term.

### **WINTER WEATHER AFFECTING SCHOOL STARTING TIMES ETC**

Well I guess now that we are in June it is timely to remind families what might happen if the weather turns particularly nasty and snow or ice make the roads so dangerous that schools around the city need to be delayed till 10am or closed for the day.

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations. It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made is that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

If you are in doubt please look up the School's website as we always post late starts or school closures on our Homepage: <http://macbayschool.edublogs.org> or just google Macandrew Bay School. Keep on looking as we can only do that once we have heard the city wide decision. It is great if you hear school is off that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school. We will also attempt to send all families an email so check your emails too.

### **FUTURE ENROLMENTS AT MACANDREW BAY SCHOOL**

We need to have up to date information about children who are likely to attend our school in the future and so if you have a pre-school child or know of a neighbour or a friend with a child who plans to send them here in the next few years then please get them to ring or email the school with the child's name, date of birth, address and parent's contact phone number. That would be really helpful for us in planning for the future.

We are particularly keen to find out if there are any New Entrants likely to start in Term 4 this year as at the moment it looks like we don't have any children turning 5 then which seems rather unusual.

Children usually start coming along for valuable pre- school visits to the New Entrant classroom about 6 weeks before they are due to start and this helps them transition successfully to school. Get in touch with us here at school about 2 months prior to your child's birthday to get this all arranged.



### **POLYFEST AND STARS ON STAGE IN TERM 3**

Next term is going to be a busy and exciting term for many of our children with the Year 4 - 6 pupils all being involved in Stars on Stage ( a Dance performance at the Regent Theatre) and also Polyfest at the Edgar Stadium.

We are starting to prepare our Kapahaka group for Polyfest and this will amp up more next term in preparation for the Maori and Pasific Island Festival that is a wonderful occasion each year. The three schools on the Peninsula usually combine together to do Polyfest but this year we are all going it alone, though I would hope we might be back together next year perhaps.

We are taking the theme of the Jungle Book Story for our Stars on Stage theme and each Senior class will have their own section of the dance to prepare. This should flow on nicely from our focus on Animals this term.

### **VOLUNTARY SCHOOL DONATIONS**

Each year we ask for a Voluntary School Donation each term and this money is used to buy reading books, maths equipment, musical instruments, sports equipment, library books and to help provide Teacher Aide Support for the children in the classes. Being a Decile 10 School means our operational funds are not all that generous and the money that comes from locally raised donations makes a big difference to the resources we can provide in the classrooms for our students.

Last year we signed up to a very useful app called PT Calendar or the Parent Teacher Calendar App. Once you have downloaded the free app to your phone you can go in and choose Otago as your region and Macandrew Bay School as your school. Once this is loaded you can then go on it to see what is coming up on the calendar, report that your child is absent (by phone, SMS or email), find contact email addresses for your child's teacher, read the latest newsletter, or read information about our school. It also allows us to send a text to any parents who are signed up to our school if we had something happen that we needed to communicate with parents about e.g. an early closing of the school if we were flooded or had some sort of emergency. We can also email all our parents in case of an emergency using etap our Student Management system, as long as we have your correct email addresses on our database.

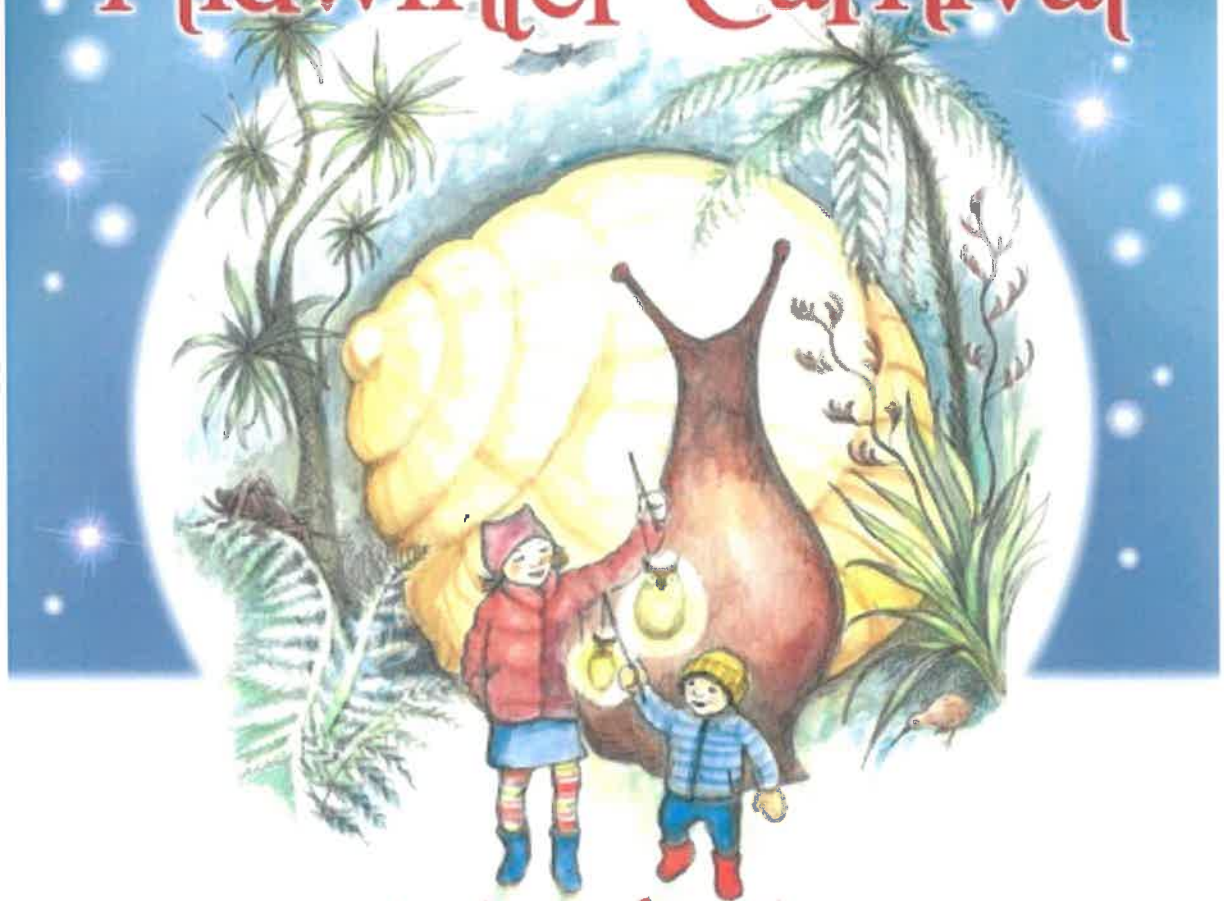
