OTAGO CHAMPS ATHLETICS DAY AT THE CALEDONIAN SPORTS GROUND

Sixteen of our children qualified to go through to the Otago Athletics Champs, which were held on Tuesday this week at the Caledonian. Well done to all of the children who represented the school so well. The Girls relay team (Malia, Ruby, Emily & Sophie) made it through to the finals and placed 4th, Michael Gardner got 5th in the discus, Hugh Jack was 3rd in the 800m, Leon was placed 12th in 800m, Taylor was placed 8th in the 800m, Jacob Levy got 4th in the High Jump and Malia Corson was 1st in Long Jump, 4th in sprints as well as being part of the relay team. Thank you to the teachers who have prepared the children well for athletics, Mr Mitchell for his organisation and to the parents for their help on the day with transport, supervision and support. It sounds like a great day despite being a bit windy and cold out there on the track.

SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY- NEXT, FRIDAY 1st DECEMBER

We had planned to run our annual School Cross Country today up the paddocks on the hills above our school but the damp weather has made the course too dangerous and therefore we will run it next Friday 1st December. It is always a fun event and I am sure next week will be no exception! We really appreciate the numerous parent volunteers who came forward this week to volunteer to help supervise the course, as this is vital for the safe running of the event. If you are unable to help next Friday please let us know. Many thanks to the Campbell family for allowing us to run through their paddocks too.

We had to change the course a bit this year as some new fence lines have gone up and so we will accessed the Cross Country course from Greenacres Street, instead of our usual Conway Street access point. We are very proud of all the children for being willing to give the Cross Country a good go. It is certainly a true cross country event and not the easiest course with hill climbs and real paddocks to run through. We love the children's persistence and determination and also the way children encourage others to do their best.

Thank you also to all you wonderful parents who I know will come along next week to encourage and support your children each year. It makes a real difference to them.

ENVIROSCHOOLS REFLECTION DAY

On Monday this week Charlotte Hutchison, myself, and the Enviroschools team worked with a large team of five Enviroschools Facilitators here at school going through a major

reflection process. Thank you to Jason and Hannah our BOT members, parent Megan Galloway, past Enviroschools teachers Therese Sharma and Judy Hawker and community member and great helper of our school Sue Pierre who came along and helped the children with the reflection process throughout the day. Thank you also to Ms Rose and the Maori Extension group who helped us with the Mihi Whakatau to welcome our visitors. It was a very big day as we thought about all the things that have happened here in the last few years since we reflected at the Silver Enviroschools level back in November 2012.

Five years later we were encouraged this year to reflect against the Green Gold criteria, which are considerably more challenging and are at the top level of Enviroschools. The children, Charlotte Hutchison and teachers did a great job of sharing so many aspects of our learning and actions that have happened over the years. The children guided the visitors around the school to show some of the things that have been put in place. We also had to think about all the things we would like to do next to help us improve what we do now. In the end it was decided that we were a close and comfortable fit at the Green Gold level, with room to move, and some clearly established next steps to put in place in the upcoming years. This was an exciting outcome and the children felt good about the effort they had put into sharing our Enviroschools journey. We really appreciate the work Charlotte has put into this role this year and the wonderful support we have had from Anna Hughes over the past four years that she has been our Facilitator. We have been lucky to have had very good Enviroschools teachers in place over a number of years supporting the children so thank you Therese, Judy, Carrie and Sarah for all your efforts.

I think we are the second primary school in Dunedin to be at this level of Enviroschools. Opoho have been a Green Gold School for many years and Otago Girls is also a Green Gold School and now we make the third school in Dunedin to be assessed to be at this level. We know we still have lots of areas we want to improve and develop further but this reflection process has been very motivating to encourage us to keep going on this journey.

2018 STAFFING

We have advertised and appointed a permanent New Entrant/ Year 1 teacher- Mel Gaul who will join us at the start of Term 1. Mel currently teaches at Grants Braes School and we think she will be an excellent fit for our school. I am sure you will all look forward to getting to know her next year. Mel is going to join us for the afternoon on Monday next week when the teachers get busy planning the 2018 programmes, based on all the ideas that the children have given us for things that they are really keen to learn about.

We have also appointed a teacher to teach the Year 4 Class next year. Nicky Bell is shifting to Dunedin from Wellington with her partner and will take up our fixed term teaching position for the year. Nicky has been teaching at Titahi Bay School in Wellington for the past seven years and comes highly recommended as an excellent and dedicated teacher, who is very experienced at this level of the school. We look forward to welcoming her to our school next year.

Mr. Mitchell is going to take Term 1 and 2 Paternity leave next year to spend time with his beautiful daughter Elysse. Matt Direen has applied for a Science Teaching Leadership Programme where he will do an in depth programme working with local scientists for 2 terms next year away from the school and he plans to do that in Terms 3 and 4. We thought a good way of managing these periods of leave was for Mr. D and Mr. Mitchell to share the Year 5 teaching role next year so Mr. D will be teaching Korimako class for Terms 1 and 2 and Mr. Mitchell will teach them for the last two terms of the year.

We will benefit hugely from Mr. D's learning in Science as he will come back in 2019 and take a leadership role to help us with getting Science learning really humming at our school. It is already an area that the children enjoy and do well in but we would like to step

it up even further.

PLANNING AFTERNOON ON MONDAY

Often we take a full day out of the school in the last few weeks of the year to review the year and to plan and prepare for the upcoming year as a staff team. This year we have decided to take an afternoon only to get underway on this task. This will happen on the afternoon of Monday the 27th next week and we will have familiar relievers in the classrooms for the afternoon, teaching the children.

JAMES AND THE GIANT PEACH CERAMICS EXHIBITION: FRIDAY 1ST DECEMBER

This term we have been able to use some of our Art Auction money to bring local ceramic artist Zehavit Darlington into the school to work with every class in the school on a collaborative ceramic project. This has revolved around the Roald Dahl story of James and the Giant Peach and the children have created various characters from the story, sculpting in clay. In one lesson they created their artworks and in the second lesson they glazed them. Zehavit has been very busy getting all the artworks fired and she has been also busy working on her own artworks inspired by the same story.

All this creativity is going to come together for a one night only exhibition at the Macandrew Bay Hall next Friday night, the 1st of December with the opening at 6pm. Our whole school community is invited. The children will be able to come along and see their own artwork and all the others made by every child in the school, as well as Zehavit's beautiful pieces too. Some of the families from Zehavit's pottery class are making peach pies at the hall in preparation for the opening which sounds like a very special idea. I hope lots of you will be able to come along and enjoy a wonderfully peachy exhibition, celebrating the creative talent in our community.

SCHOOL POOL SEASON 2017/ 2018

This coming swimming season we are looking for people to step up and become a part of the Pool Custodians' team. We are hoping to have a group of people to share the jobs that are needed in the smooth of running the pool over the summer. We need help with roster, pool maintenance, chemical purchase, water quality and general smooth running of the pumps and filter systems. It has been great that a number of people have come forward in this past week and it looks like we now have the team we need to transition into taking over the role from Joni Simpson and Amanda Brown. The pool will now definitely open in mid December and be available for families to pay for a key and go swimming with their families over the summer holidays at the pool and into Term 1 while the pool is open.

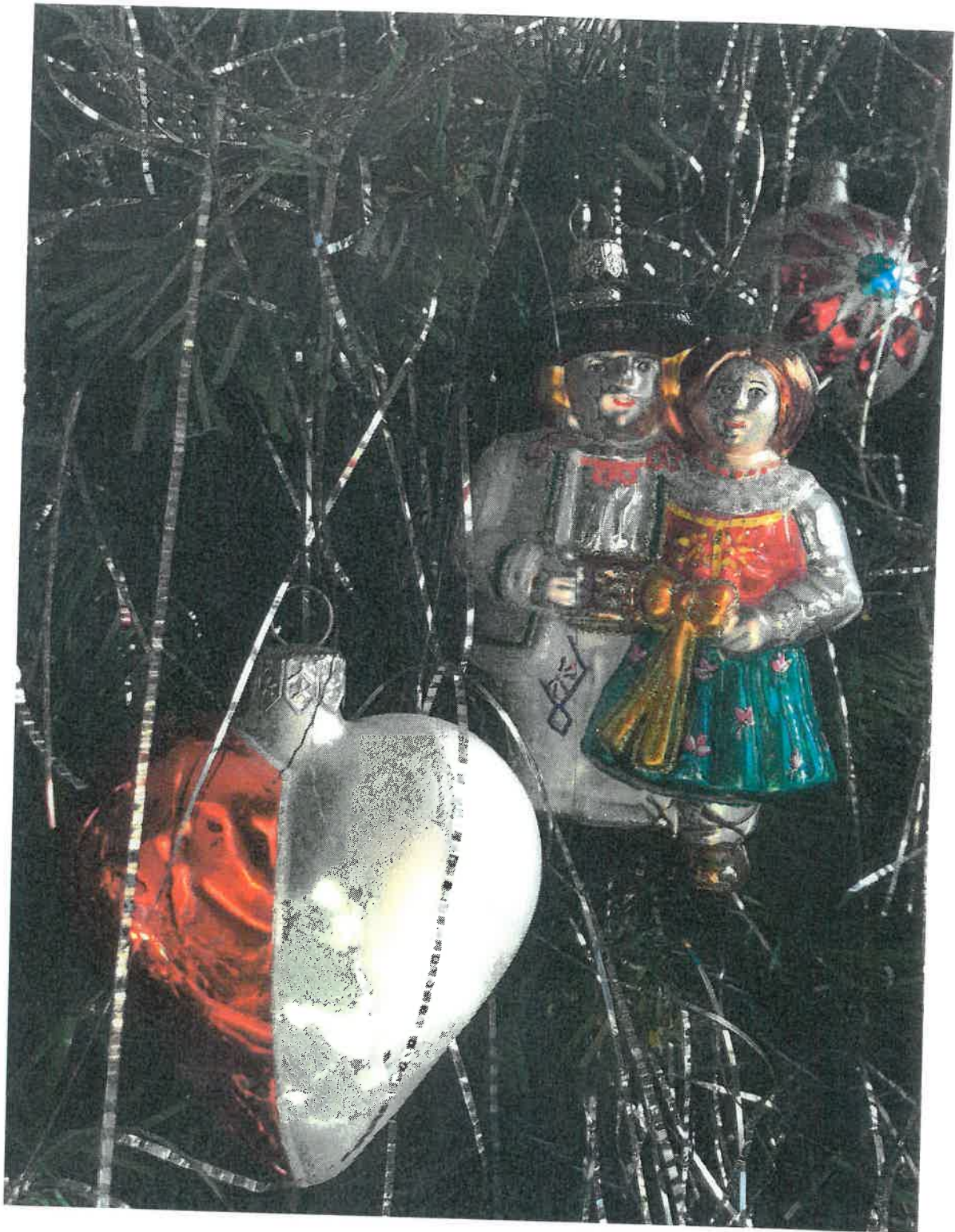
