Kia ora koutou katoa,
Greetings Parents and Caregivers

Welcome back to Term 3 everybody. I hope families had a good time together over the school holiday break. It was a bit of a traumatic finish to the holidays with the deluge of rain on Friday and Saturday having quite an impact on many properties and roads around the area. Sadly we were flooded again in the Music Room and Sports shed and will have to get these buildings repaired again, just as we had to after the June 2015 floods.

The Play Centre playground has also been badly affected with mud and silt doing significant damage. We are thinking of all the families in our area and on the Taieri that have had problems with their homes and businesses and hope that things will improve soon for those affected.

EPro8 SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY EVENT

Eight of our Yr 5 and 6 children headed to Balmacewan with Mr Direen on Wednesday morning this week to take part in some exciting hands on Technology challenges where they got to construct their own solutions to some challenging technological, engineering and electronic problems. We have never had this opportunity before and I think it was an excellent thing for some of our children to have a go at. Thanks to Keren Graham, Jacqui Hay and Rhys Latton who helped out with the transport. Well done Michael, Aleksander, Leon, Tristan, Sam, Malia, Dimitri and Marcos. We know that it was really challenging and there was lots of learning involved but I hear you all gave it a really good go!

TERM THREE'S TOPIC: COPING WITH CHALLENGES AND BEING PREPARED

Our latest weather event was almost timed uncannily to perfection as our focus this term is on the challenge of survival for people as they prepare for and respond to weather events or natural disasters. We will be thinking about how we can prepare as a family at home, at school and how our community can prepare to cope with the unexpected events that can come along when we least expect them. This is mainly a Health and Social Sciences unit of learning.

We are looking forward to hearing Michelle Poole from the Otago Regional Council talk to the children on Wednesday the 9th of August about how to be prepared to cope with things like flooding etc.

We will learn about the science behind the natural forces that cause natural phenomena like floods, earthquakes, tsunamis, tornadoes, cyclones and volcanic eruptions etc as part of this topic too.

WINTER WEATHER AFFECTING SCHOOL STARTING TIMES ETC

It is very timely to remind families what might happen if the weather turns particularly nasty and snow or ice make the roads so dangerous that schools around the city need to be delayed till 10am or closed for the day.

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations. It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made is that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

If you are in doubt please look up the School's website as we always post late starts or school closures on our Homepage: <http://macbayschool.edublogs.org> or just google Macandrew Bay School to get to our website. Keep on looking as we can only do that once we have heard the city wide decision. It is great if you hear school is off that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school. We will also attempt to send all families a text or an email so check your texts and emails too. I tried this out last weekend with our concern about the state of the Bay Road after the slips in case of frost and the text system seemed to work well.

KAIMANUA CHALLENGE, HEALTH TEAM

In term 3 the Health Team decided to do a Fruit and Vegetable bowl because it's cold and the flu season. So many people only get a small amount of Vitamins and Minerals. So if you have any spare fruit or vegetables we would really appreciate it if you could please bring them to school so in the afternoon, your teacher will cut it up "so you can all have part of your daily dose of Vitamins and Minerals!"

Each class has been given a few posters, a healthy guide to a healthy heart catalogue and a vegetable cookbook.

We start the Fruit and Vegetable bowl in week 2 of Term 3.

We have set a challenge for every class to use that Vegetable cookbook to create a dish or two that would be worthy to taste.

Books will be available with a wide appeal for all ages of children. Once again we will not be sending wish lists home but we will take each class through the Book Fair to have a look at the books and parents will also have the opportunity to look through the Book Fair, both with and without children, before and after school. If you can't get along during the week and would like your child to bring home a wish list send a note along to the Office and we will give your child a wish list sheet.

This is such a great way to get lovely new books for our Library as a percentage of the sales earns the school free Library books.

As a culmination to our Book Fair week we are inviting all the children and teachers to get dressed up as a character from a book or movie they like and to come to school for the day on Friday 1 September dressed as their Book Character. We will have a sharing time at approximately 9.10am where everyone can see all the dress ups in the Library. Parents are very welcome to stay on so they can meet all the characters too. Usually we get each child to introduce themselves and tell us who they are dressed up as!

POLYFEST AND STARS ON STAGE IN TERM 3

This term is going to be a busy and exciting term for many of our children with the Year 4 - 6 pupils all being involved in Stars on Stage (an evening of dance performances at the Regent Theatre) and also another highlight will be the Otago Polyfest at the Edgar Stadium for the children in our Kapahaka group.

We are taking the theme of the Jungle Book Story for our Stars on Stage theme and each Senior class will have their own section of the dance to prepare. This should flow on nicely from our focus on Animals last term. The Stars on Stage performances will be on at the Regent on the week starting the 4th of September but we won't know until closer to the time what night our Macandrew Bay children will be performing.

We have started to prepare our Kapahaka group for Polyfest and this will amp up more this term in preparation for the Maori and Pasific Island Festival that is a wonderful occasion each year. The three schools on the Peninsula usually combine together to do Polyfest but this year we are all going it alone, though I would hope we might be back together next year perhaps. Polyfest will be on a week later than Stars on Stage starting on the 12th of September-15th September. I am hoping we will be performing on either the Thursday or the Friday of that week but we just have to wait and see which day we will be allocated.

ARIKI CUP CROSS COUNTRY TEAMS

Mr Mitchell is working with some of our keen long distance runners from Yrs 4-6 to get them prepared to run in the Ariki Cup which is coming up in the third week of this term. The Inter school Cross Country event involves all schools in the Sth Dunedin and Peninsula area. We will have a team of 6 boys and 6 girls. It will be run on Tuesday the 8th

of August if weather allows or Thursday the 10th of August if it needs to be postponed. Mr Mitchell will let the children know the details of the event and send a notice home to those involved. It is always great fun for parents to come along and watch and we are always very proud of the attitude and effort shown by our runners. Good luck to the children involved. Hopefully you will get out and do plenty of practice runs prior to the race.

WRITING CORNER

Epro 8 challenge writing

On Wednesday the 26th of July, Michael, Leon, Alexander and Tristan from Toroa and Dimitri, Marcos, Malia and me (Sam McGee) from Korimako went to the EPro 8 Challenge at Balmacewen Intermediate. We were split into 2 teams of 4.

The EPro 8 Challenge was a technology and engineering competition where we had to meet certain tasks to score points. Each team had a book with criteria and the rules and information about the tasks ahead.

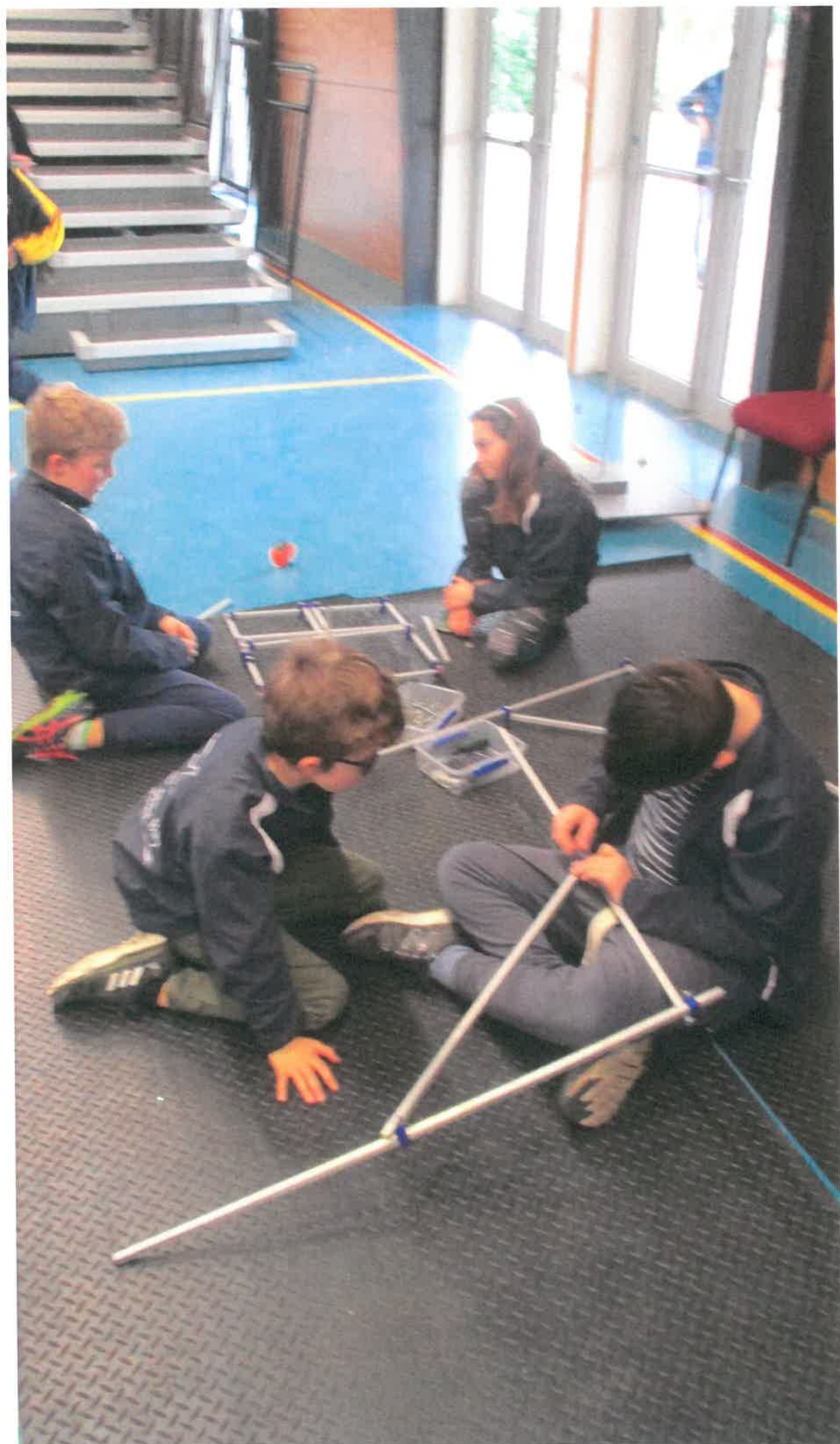
The building criteria and materials we could use were wires, batteries, screwdrivers, motors, joiners, metal sticks, 90 degree joiners and axles. All the plastic material had been created by a 3D printer taking 5,000 hours!

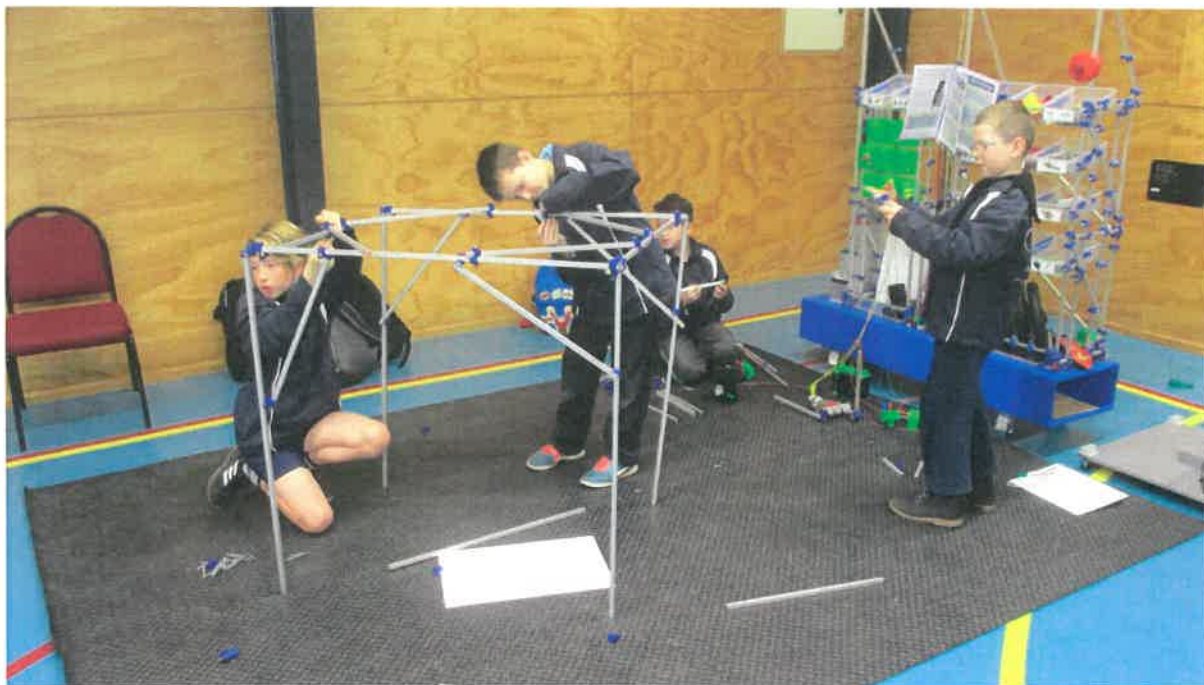
My Team tried to build a bridge but it was too difficult so we ended up making a laser that shone on the roof and an apparatus that floated a balloon 1.2metres high for 10 seconds. We also got points for having a tidy workstation. We scored 140 points altogether and finished 8th out of 12 teams.

The other Team created an electronic guard dog. It had an electronic bark, could wag its tail and could open and close its jaws. Unfortunately, when they had to move it some things broke down but they were still able to score lots of points just before the competition finished. Their team scored 150 points and finished 6th.

It was a very hard challenge but we're very grateful that MR D chose me to do it.

VOLUNTARY SCHOOL DONATIONS
