CAMP AT YEAR 6 SCHOOL BERWICK

A Camp Meeting will be held in Toroa Class on Wednesday 2nd November at 5.00pm. All Year 6 families are invited to come so you can hear more about Camp, the programme, costs, gear list requirements etc. This is very important for parents particularly who hope to go to Camp or come for a visit, but very worth while for all.

The Camp will be held at Berwick out on the Taieri (28Nov – 2 Dec) for the week from Monday to Friday. A great programme of activities have been planned by Mrs Ward, including Abseiling, River Safety programme, rafting, Obstacle course, Search and Rescue activities, kayaking, walking, Wearable Art, a quiz and a concert and much more! The children will have a ball as always.

SCHOOL POOL

Great progress has been made over the holidays. The new pumping and filtration system that runs the pool is in place, new handrails, new concrete around the outside of the pool and a new PVC rubber liner for the pool tank have been installed. (We are not walking on this yet or putting anything on top of it).

We are nearly up to the final stages of testing things out and a few cosmetic improvements so the pool should be all go with the new system in time for the usual swimming season (early to mid December until Anniversary Day in March). We are so grateful for the wonderful support we got with all our fundraising that made this possible to upgrade and improve our School and Community Pool so it could carry on for many more years. Our money did not run to replacing the roof but that might be another project. We are thrilled that the new system means that the pool will only need to be tested night and morning, instead of the 5 times a day checking system we have had in the past. This will make the pool roster more manageable for everyone.

We may need to close access to the pool for a couple of days next week to allow us to fill the pool, commission it and check the new system is working well. We will then have to empty it again to allow us to use it for Fair storage. If there is a note on the pool saying Access Closed then Fair things can still be left in the Learning Street for those couple of days.

We are shifting the Sausage Sizzle date to the 18th of Nov so we can use up any sausages that are not needed for the Fair. Orders in please by 9am on Wed the 16th of November

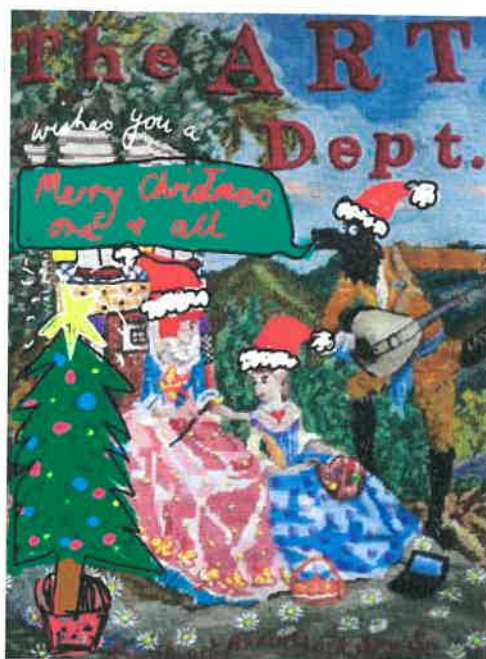
ART WORKSHIPS FOR YOUNG ARTISTS

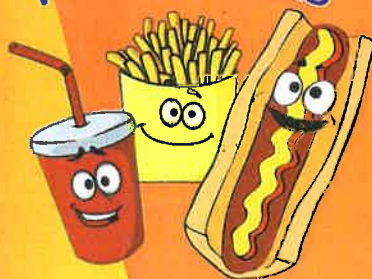

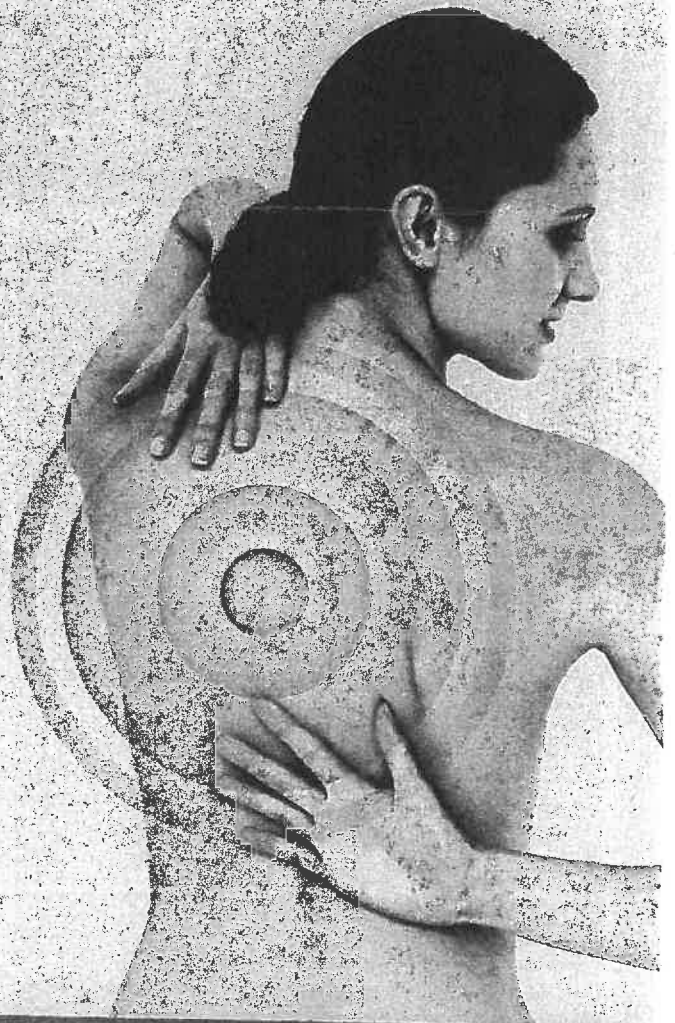
