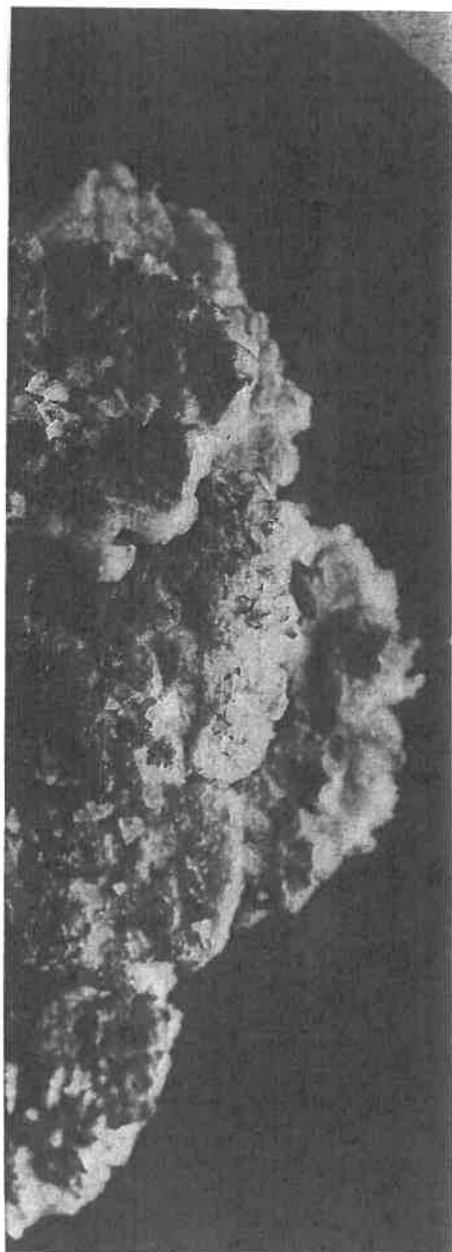

### **COOKING CLUB –recipe from this week's cooking with Bridget**



This was absolutely delicious and smelled great too so you may want to cook this at home! The children love cooking with Bridget each week!



#### INGREDIENTS

1 Tbsp extra-virgin olive oil or ghee + extra, for frying  
2 cloves garlic, finely chopped  
2 tsp finely grated ginger  
400g (1 1/4 large) cauliflower, roughly chopped into  
1cm pieces (approx. 2 scant cups once chopped)  
1 1/2 teaspoons fennel seeds, lightly toasted and  
roughly ground  
110g (1 cup) chickpea (chana or besan) flour  
1/2 teaspoon ground turmeric  
1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt  
1/4 teaspoon baking soda, sifted

Heat oil or ghee in a large frying pan over medium-high heat. Add garlic and ginger and stir for 20-30 seconds until fragrant. Add chopped cauliflower and fennel seeds and continue to cook for 5-8 minutes, stirring continuously, until tender and just starting to colour. Remove from heat and set aside to cool.

Place chickpea flour, turmeric, salt and baking soda in a bowl, and whisk to combine before adding 125ml (1/2 cup) cold water and whisking to form a thick batter. Set aside until cauliflower is cool. Mix cauliflower into batter.

Heat a large frying pan over medium-high heat and add a good few glugs of extra-virgin olive oil. Cook large tablespoonfuls of batter in batches, pressing the batter out to form thin fritters (the batter will seem a tad thick, that's okay). Cook until golden on the underside and bubbles appear on the surface. Flip and cook for a further minute or until cooked through. Remove from pan and transfer to a paper towel-lined plate. Cook remaining batter.

To make sauce, combine all ingredients in a blender along with 2-3 tablespoons water, a good pinch of fine sea salt and blend on high until smooth-ish. Taste and adjust seasoning. Serve hot fritters with mint and coriander sauce on the side.

### **LATE STARTS OR SCHOOL CANCELLATION DUE TO WEATHER CONDITIONS**

As June is now here I thought it might be wise to remind parents of the processes that are in place for our School and other Dunedin Schools in case of adverse weather conditions such as now and ice.

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations. It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made are that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

It is great if you hear school is off that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school.

### **IMPORTANT HEALTH INFORMATION – MEASLES PREPAREDNESS – from Southern District Health Board**

#### **Measles update**

You may be aware there is currently a measles outbreak in New Zealand, so far mainly affecting communities in the North Island.



This as a timely reminder to check your child's vaccination status and ensure they are up to date with their vaccinations. Please let your school or early childcare centre know your child's vaccination status, if you haven't already done so. They will require written evidence of which vaccines your child has had. You may also use this as an opportunity to review the vaccination status of your whole family.

Two MMR vaccinations provide the best protection for measles, and the vaccine is normally given at 15 months and 4 years of age. The MMR vaccine was not on the childhood immunisation schedule until 1990. That means many adults and parents may not have received the required 2 doses of MMR and are encouraged to contact their practice nurse to discuss catch-up MMR. If you are unsure, you can check with your GP or your Wellchild book for your vaccination history. Catch-up MMR is available for all children and adults who have not received their two MMR doses on today's current schedule.

If a child becomes sick with measles at your school or centre, children that are not considered immune to measles will be excluded.

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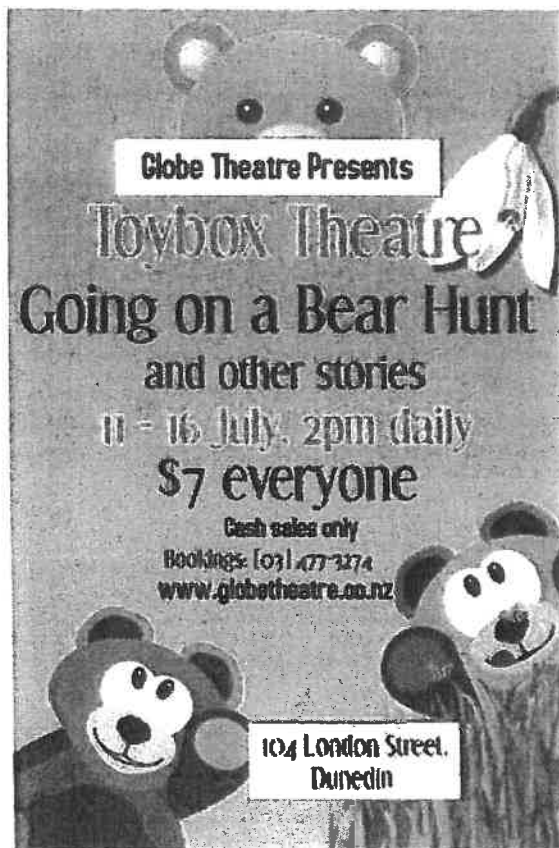

The ascending group have been *called* by the elderly woman.

- this is an example of a passive sentence

Ko te *karanga* te mahi tuatahi o te pōwhiri.

The *karanga* is the very first thing to happen at a welcoming ceremony.

- this is an example of an equative sentence
