As part of my involvement in the Maori Achievement Collaborative, I was one of 120 school principals and teachers attending the national MAC Wananga in Waitara, Taranaki for a few days at the beginning of this week. A highlight of the gathering was staying on Owae Marae in Waitara, doing a tour of the Taranaki Land War sites and a visit to Parihaka Pa where we had a chance to hear more of the history of that place.

With the recent announcement that teaching NZ history will be a compulsory part of the NZ curriculum at all year levels I was reminded how history comes alive when you have the chance to stand on the place that important events have taken place and hear about them from people closely associated with those events.

We live in a place with a rich history on this Peninsula and I think that will be a great thing for the children to find out more about this in the future. It is exciting to know that our NZ history is being valued and that people are starting to realise how important it is that we all learn more about our NZ stories.

## **PENINSULA ATHLETICS DAY AT THE CALEDONIAN SPORTS GROUND** **(For all children Yr. 0-6)**

We will be joining with Portobello and Broad Bay Schools again to run our annual Athletics Day at the Caledonian Sports Grounds down near Logan Park High School on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> of October with a postponement date of Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> October. The children rotate around a range of different Athletic activities in a group with all the children in their age group across the three schools. In the afternoon relays and races are run. Parents are very welcome to come and watch for all or some of the day. We would like to get a sense of how many buses we may need to order to get the children to and from the Athletics Day, so we have asked families to let us know if they plan to transport their own children independently. When buses are so expensive it is silly to pay for more buses than are required. Can you please fill in your tear off slip about transport and it must be back to us by Wednesday the 16<sup>th</sup> of October at the latest, which is in the first week of Term 4.

Children will need to be at the Caledonian by 9.20 ready for a 9.30am start. The day is likely to finish at 2.15 or 2.30pm. If your child is catching the bus on the morning then they will need to be at school by 8.45am as we will be on the bus by 8.55am and away.

Children need to wear their Macandrew Bay T-Shirt if they have one and hopefully everybody has got them. If not, we do have them for sale for \$20.00 each and Sunhats for \$10.00 each.

Children need to wear sensible shoes for Sports Day, a Macandrew Bay School T-Shirt, wear a sunhat, have sunblock to apply, bring a packed lunch and drink bottle.

For older children who have outgrown their T-Shirt but won't want another one could they please just wear a plain blue T-Shirt.

If the weather is doubtful listen to the local radio stations for a cancellation notice seeing we have a postponement date up our sleeve. Morning tea break will be at 10.30 – 10.50am and lunch 12.30 – 12.50pm approximately. We will also text families if we have to postpone or cancel, and we will also put a postponement notice or cancellation on our website.

Children usually start coming along for valuable pre- school visits to the New Entrant classrooms about 6 weeks before they are due to start and this helps them transition successfully to school. Get in touch with us here at school about 2 months prior to your child's birthday to get this all arranged.

Numbers have increased at Macandrew Bay therefore Magic can no longer have a casual

approach to the bookings, and need you to help them out and book the night before or before 9am on the day, if that is possible please. They check bookings for the day up until 12pm. The sooner they know the numbers for the day the easier it is to call in that extra staff member. Also as Mac Bay is a bit further out of the main Dunedin area, staff coming from the university area need time to organise and travel to the Centre. That is why Magic are asking you to book if needed on the day before 9am, rather than waiting till 12pm.

Please note that Express Bookings need to be “emergency only” (we normally have this option for this reason). All our other Centres parents know this option is for emergencies only. As your Centre has normally had lower numbers we have let this option become the “norm” for bookings. Therefore as above we cannot have this option as a casual basis. We can still express book your child in, but this may result in us being over ratio. Therefore please use this option as a last minute option.

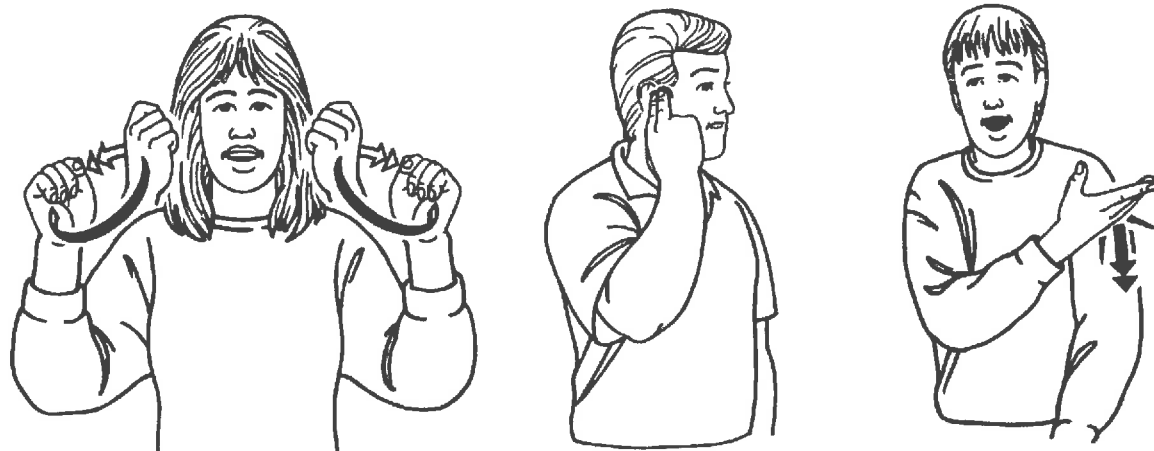

Book this date to connect with scientists, rūnaka and the community to experience the biodiversity and local knowledge that makes North Dunedin coastlines special.

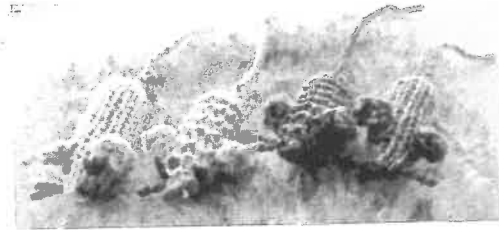
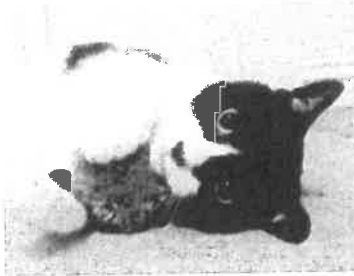
