Possible Teacher Strike - Wednesday 31st May

As you may be aware, primary teachers across Aotearoa have been contemplating action following the rejection of the Ministry of Education's third offer with respect to their contracts. NZEI members voted in favour of taking a one day strike next Wednesday the 31st of May. Since this decision was made, the minister of education has initiated further negotiations with both the primary and secondary sector. The NZEI executive team have

paused the strike and any other industrial action with the hope that progress can be made to achieve collective contracts that suit all parties.

So although we have pressed pause on a potential strike action day next Wednesday, we won't know for sure until we hear further news about the outcome of this negotiation process on Sunday 28th May.

We understand how tricky it is to organise alternative arrangements when the school may be closed for instruction and we apologise in advance for this potential disruption. We are really hoping Sunday brings a favourable outcome and school will go ahead as usual on Wednesday 31st May.



Matariki/Puaka Celebrations - Thursday 29th June

Matariki is known as the Māori New Year in Te Ao Māori (the Māori world view). Closely connected with the maramataka (the Māori lunar calendar), the reappearance of the Matariki stars in the early morning sky brings the past year to a close and marks the beginning of the new year.

Mātauranga Māori (ancestral knowledge and wisdom) is at the heart of celebrations of the Matariki public holiday and it will be a time for; Remembrance – Honouring those we have lost since the last rising of Matariki Celebrating the present – Gathering together to give thanks for what we have Looking to the future – Looking forward to the promise of a new year Historically, the stars of Matariki were also closely tied to planting, harvesting and hunting. If the stars appeared clear and bright, it signified an abundant season ahead. This year.

Matariki falls on Friday 14 July in 2023, marking the reappearance of the constellation. The best time to view the Matariki cluster is early morning, just before dawn.

Last year we had a whole day of fun activities to celebrate Matariki and this was a wonderful opportunity for us as a school and a community to reconnect, reflect on the past, the present, the future and each other.

We are planning to do the same again this year on Thursday 29th June. Our wonderful staff and even some of our tamariki will be teaching different workshops to celebrate Matariki. We would love you to come in and join us for the day. Please let us know if you would be willing to teach a workshop, email either Nic or Jess. Last year we had some of our whānau members teaching how to make waffles, gardening, knitting and Art. Don't be shy, come in and join the fun!

We have decided to postpone a planned Hangi until 2024. This will enable us more time to plan and get ready for a really special event next year. Thanks to the whānau members that have offered to help, we will be in touch to make a plan for 2024.

- Whānau / Parent School Interviews


Term 2- Mid year reporting

Seesaw acts as a window into the classroom showing what your child has learnt, expressed in their own voice, as a reflection on their learning experiences. Teachers are also developing ways to use this platform to set tasks that the tamariki can work on at home to support their learning.

Get Firewise education next Friday

The Get Firewise programme is a curriculum-based resource that gives children of primary and intermediate age the knowledge and behaviour they need to stay fire safe and escape from a burning building. It has been quite a few years since we have had a chance to teach the tamariki about this very important area.

The Get Firewise programme teaches children lifelong behaviours that will help them stay safe. It's been developed using best practice techniques for teaching safety information to children.

There is a strong focus on literacy and the resources provided give children the opportunities to practise new fire-safe behaviours across a range of engaging activities like role-plays, drawings and story-telling.

We welcome Scott Haines who will be delivering a catch up Get Firewise programme in our kura with all our tamariki next Friday 2nd June. Going forward we hope to be able to include this programme regularly for our Year 1 and 2 classes.



Icy roads or snowy conditions

In the event of very dangerous road conditions due to snow or black ice etc a blanket decision is made for the whole of Dunedin by Principals who live in the hill suburbs, after consulting Police etc. This includes Macandrew Bay School.

A decision is made on either a late start at 10.00am or to close Dunedin Schools for the day. It is very important that families listen to the radio if weather conditions are bad in town and

particularly listen to the cancellation notices on local radio stations (89.4 FM The Hits). It is usually on after the 7.30am news and again at 8.00am. The reason these decisions are made is that even if children can get to school the staff often live some distance from the school and up on the hills and we can't guarantee that we can staff the school even if the children can make it.

Keep on looking/listening as sometimes a late decision is made. It is great if you hear that school is off, that you let your friends and neighbours know too if their children also attend our school. We will also push out a message on Skool Loop and Nic will text you too! It is great we have all these means of communication to let you know! Fingers crossed we don't have too many of these delayed starts or closures.

You can also add the join the Otago Primary Principals' Association (OPPA) group on School Loop, details attached. School Loop allows you to add multiple schools/organisations. You will be asked for a password once you have selected OPPA. This password is OPPA.

Need a hand? Just come to the office.



Future enrolments at Macandrew Bay

We need to be able to accurately predict our roll for up to three years ahead and need your help to get our prospective enrolment information as accurate as possible. This information is really important for our July 1st roll return data which is used to generate our staffing entitlement for each year.

We need to have up to date information about children who are likely to attend our school in the future and so if you have a pre-school child or know of a neighbour or a friend with a child who plans to send them here this year or in the next few

years and who lives within our school zone then please get them to ring or email the school with the child's name, date of birth, address and parent's contact phone number. That would be really helpful for us in planning for the future.

Children usually start coming along for valuable pre- school visits to the New Entrant classrooms about 6 weeks before they are due to start and this helps them transition successfully to school. Get in touch with us here at school about 2 months prior to your child's birthday to get this all arranged.

We are happy to arrange times to show families around the school if you want to know more about the school before putting your child on our enrolment list. Just ring the school or email Nic on principal@macandrewbay.school.nz

Voluntary School donations and Sports Fees

VOLUNTARY SCHOOL DONATIONS - Your support makes a big difference to our school budget!

Although this is voluntary it does make a big difference to our school operations and finances if people do opt to pay it and it means that the children get a better deal in the classroom and the school has some hope of breaking even financially each year.

We try very hard to keep costs to a minimum for families. Our suggested School Donations this year are the same amount as last year - \$25.00 per term or \$100.00 per child for the whole year. You are more than welcome to pay these per term or for the whole year – whichever suits you. Some parents have set up regular small direct debit contributions and that is fine also. It is worth parents knowing that the receipt you receive for any donations made to school can be used for an income tax credit from Inland Revenue.

The bank account details are Macandrew Bay School 02 0900 0000233 00.

You need to state clearly your child's name and what the money is for in the reference information e.g school donation, activity donation, sports fees, stationary etc.

You can also pay with cash or eftpos at the school office.

The suggested Activity Donation again is \$10.00 per child per term, or you may wish to pay \$40.00 for the whole year in one go. This money is used to help cover the costs of buses and activities such as going to the Museum, Sports Events, Toitu, Art Gallery, and it also pays for visits to school by different musical and drama performing groups etc, though Art Auction funds also help with these activities too. Payment can be made with eftpos at the school office or by internet banking to the school account.

SPORTS FEES

We offer many sporting opportunities for children outside of school hours. Participation in these teams is reliant on payment of the fee by a set date. This is a fee, not a donation, as it is not part of the required school curriculum, so must be paid in order for your child to participate.

Please plan to bring cans to school the week of the 19th of June leading up to Thursday the 22nd, offical collection day.




Building a Climate of Hope - E Tu Te Mana O Te Ao: a Call for Climate Actions
